A bit of Trivia

Last month I asked: *How many Grand Masters of Grand Encampments has Indiana had from time immemorial?*

Maybe it would have been easier had I said from 1854 to present. 1854 is when the first Encampment was formed in Indiana. From 1854 to 1858 Grand Commanderies as we know them today were styled Grand Encampments. Thus, those who served in Indiana held the title of Most Eminent Grand Master of Indiana. After 1858 those who presided received the title of Grand Commander.

The answer is five (5) from Indiana who served as Most Eminent Grand Masters of Encampment. In reverse order they were / are:

Sir Knight Duane Lee Vaught: who was elected as Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of the USA in Buffalo, NY in August of 2015, and is currently serving as Grand Master. I have had the opportunity to spend many evenings and days with Duane and served as Grand Commander two years after his tenure as Grand Commander of Indiana.

Sir Knight Willard Meredith Avery: who was elected as Grand Master of Grand Encampment of the USA in Kansas City, in August of 1976 serving to August of 1979. Willard loved to watch the Pacers but always had time for me to sit beside him in his chair and discuss and solve all the problems we have in Indiana Templary. I miss those visits.

Sir Knight Leonidas P. Newby: who was elected as Grand Master of Grand Encampment of the USA in New Orleans, in August of 1922 serving to August of 1926. From my evening visits with Sir Knight Avery, I was told that Newby wanted to be elected into the Grand Encampment line and formed a committee to help him in his efforts. Each year he would invite the committee of Sir Knights to join him for dinner at a nice restaurant, in which he would pick up the tab for the evening. Thus was formed the Newby dinner which followed in 1980 by the Newby/Avery dinner to honor the Indiana Past Grand Masters of Grand Encampment.

Sir Knight Ephriam Colestock; who was elected as Grand Master of **Grand Encampment of Indiana** in Lafayette, in December of 1857 for one year to December of 1858. He was Eminent Commander of Raper Commander when **he was elected in 1858 as Grand Commander of Indiana** but declined his second term.

And lastly, make that first to serve was, **Sir Knight Henry C. Lawrence:** who was elected as Grand Master of **Grand Encampment of Indiana** in Lafayette, in December of 1854 serving for three terms to December of 1857. This past month I visited his Grave site in Knowlesville, NY and will follow next month with a bit more information about this very interesting Sir Knight.

The time is here to start thinking about the annual Easter Sunrise Service Trip to Washington, D.C. This years trip will be hosted by Grand Commander Don Olvey and Lady Nina. We will gather, as usual, in Indianapolis, on Tuesday, April 11th, but on the south side this year as to be in a better location to head south. At this time, I can't name the hotel because of reservation delays but you will have plenty of notice before we leave. Early on Wednesday we will head to Louisville, KY to have breakfast trackside while watching the horses practice at Churchill Downs. This will be followed by a tour and a stop at the museum. I'm thinking AWESOME. From there we will head to West Virginia for the night so we will be fresh for our voyage into the world of science at the National Radio Astronomy Observatory in Green Bank, WV. There we will see the largest steerable satellite (485 feet tall) that they use to listen for sounds in space. At the science center we will learn and see all sorts of interesting "spacer things as well as have lunch at the Starlight Café. Friday, in DC we will visit the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, the largest Catholic Church in the US, and totally breathtaking. Friday afternoon we well visit the Stables of the Old Guard where the horses used at Arlington Cemetery are housed and trained. We will also have our pizza party in the Hospitality on Friday night followed by our night tour of DC. On Saturday, our traditional wreath laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown will be in the morning with the Grand Encampment Banquet on Saturday evening. The trip wraps up with our Easter Service and march up Shooter's Hill on Easter morning.


