Paul A. Cole, KCT, PGC: Paul underwent emergency surgery Tuesday on a perforated bowel. The poison from the bowel is throughout his system, and they are in the process trying to clear it out. Nothing further is known at this time, but he is in room 3 of ICU. Please keep Paul and Margaret in your prayers.

Update 5/31: I just heard from Margaret Cole. She said that Paul was doing better and that it now looks like Paul will make it through this battle, but that it will take a long time to recover. He is not out of the woods yet, but things look better right now. His doctors are hopeful. There is a lot of poison in his system from the perforated bowel. Update 6/1: I just left the Major Hospital and visited with Paul and Margaret. Paul is by no means out of the woods yet but the Doctor's are now "Optimistic" that he will make a recovery. Yesterday they were not optimistic at all per Margaret! He has had his breathing tube and main artery line removed and is breathing on his own now. He can speak and can communicate a little with you when he wants too and gets a little aggravated with Margaret at times.....per his daughters this shows good signs!! He has regained a lot of his color back; his vitals are good and has a good light hand grip. They had him setting on the side of the bed earlier today and plan to have him up in a chair tomorrow. One of his Doctors is

Dr. Laura Rife, a Past Honored Queen for our Jobs Daughters here in Shelbyville so Paul is not only in good medical hands but also Masonic hands. Her mother Bonnie was in visiting also and said that she was there yesterday and he is in much better condition today than yesterday. Both of Paul and Margaret's daughters are staying here in Shelbyville for a while and their son Matt lives here and their son Mark returned home today to Ohio because he was not feeling well. When I went to leave, he apologized for not getting up and said to tell everyone he was sorry he didn't make our meeting on Monday. As you know, Paul and Margaret are very devout Christians and practice and preach Christianity and believe in the Power of Prayer. Their Family can use our Prayers at this time! Update 6/4: Hi Larry, I visited Paul this evening. Margaret asked me to send an update to you so you pass along the information. I was surprised how good Paul's color was this evening. He was sitting up in the chair and had been all day. This morning he walked down the hallway about 60 feet. He is still in quite a bit of pain and receiving morphine injections. He is getting a PICC line in the morning so they can give him some medications more easily and increase the nutrition he is getting. Right now he is only eating ice chips. He will soon go on a clear liquid diet, moving on to soup, then solid foods. They are not yet discussing when he may be released from the hospital, but he will most likely go to a rehab facility to regain some strength before returning home. He will have another surgery in 3-4 months to repair some of the damage. While I was visiting, I had the opportunity to talk to both of their daughters. Paul and Margaret's grandson is getting married in Michigan in the middle of the month. They were very much looking forward to the trip to visit with family and finally get to hold their new great grandson. Obviously they will not be making the trip, but the rest of the family is still going. The family has asked that we make sure they have lots of visitors from June 14-21. I will send out more information closer to that time to let you know where he is and what the visiting hours are. Monica Peterson

George Weister: Janice and I spent the Sunday afternoon and part of the early evening visiting with first of all Brother George Weister at Mulberry. We found him to be in good spirits, but obviously very concerned about his health problems. The infection now is only in his right knee joint as it appears the rest of his body is infection free at this time. The next steps are to have some tests which he has scheduled this week to determine the steps in trying to eradicate the infection in his left. They are

actually looking at removing his current knee joint which he had replaced a few years ago. They seem to feel that some sort of "slime" has attached itself to the joint and they may not be able to get rid of the infection without removing the joint. This would leave him bed ridden for a period of time for it to heal up before they could replace his old joint with a new joint. This would take several weeks for recovery but looks as though this is what they may have to do. He indicated that he would certainly welcome visitors starting this Wednesday thru next Thursday as Sandi will be at Indy for Grand Lodge of Indiana with her duties there. 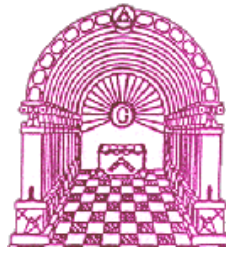
