Warrant from W. B. Hubbard, General Grand Master of the General Grand Encampment, of the United States, to form a State Grand Encampment for the State of Indiana was dated at Columbus, Ohio, on April 24, 1854.

The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

Sir Knight Thornley was born December 21, 1924, in Meyersdale, Pennsylvania. He attended Carnegie Institute of Technology before the War, and went to Colorado in1946 to attend the Colorado School of Mines. He has three children: Elizabeth (Mrs. William H. Koon, II), William III and Robert. His wife, Shirley Jane, died in September, 1991.

A Registered Professional Engineer, Sir Knight Thornley is a consulting Materials Engineer. He is a Fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers, a member of the National Society of Professional Engineers, American Institute of Mining Engineers, Society of American Military Engineers, U.S. Committee for Large Dams, International Committee for Soil Mechanics and Foundation Engineering and the American Society for Testing Materials.

A veteran of World War II, he served with the 90th Infantry Division in Europe, where he was wounded and decorated for gallantry in action four times. He holds four campaign stars and an arrowhead for the invasion of Normandy. He is a member of Christ Church, Episcopal.

He received the degree of Master Mason on June 25, 1946, in King Solomon's Lodge No.346, F. & A. M., Connellsville, Pennsylvania, and the Capitular Degrees in Colorado Chapter No. 29, R.A.M., serving as High Priest in 1959 and Treasurer since 1962. In the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Colorado, he served as Most Excellent Grand High Priest in 1966. His Cryptic record shows membership in Denver Council No. 1, C.M., where he served as Thrice Illustrious Master in 1977. He served the Grand council of Cryptic Masons of Colorado as Most Illustrious Grand Master in 1986. He is a member of both the Order of High Priesthood and the Order of the Silver Trowel.

He was the Charter Commander of St. Bernard Commandery No. 41, K.T., when it was formed in 1983. He is Past President of the Colorado Past Commandery Association.

He is retired from Kentucky Transportation Cabinet after thirty-five years of service. He entered the Naval Reserve while still in high school and retired after forty-two years of total service.



Our drill teams provide an excellent opportunity for fellowship and to develop Asylum skills in our Commanderies. Sir Knights regularly meet to improve their tactics, teamwork, and uniform

appearance to prepare for our drill competitions. In addition to the annual drill competition held in conjunction with our Grand Conclave, last year the Grand Commandery was asked to organize a drill exhibition at the Masonic Home Festival. Eight teams participated in what will hopefully become an annual event. Steve Barton and the Drill Committee also provided drill instructions at four sites throughout the state in preparation for this year's annual competition following this Conclave.

• Ritual and Tactics

A candidate's first impressions of the inner workings of Templary are the portrayal of our Orders. If our ritual work is done without reading, with a good delivery, our movements are precise, in unison, and our robes and uniforms are neat in appearance and well fitting we have a much better chance of getting that new Sir Knight active than if our work is poor and sloppy. Our Instructionals this year were intended to address those Commanderies who wanted to improve their self-image through a better presentation of the Order of The Temple. The Ritual and Tactics Committee also revised our Tactics for ease of use and execution.

• Masonic Home Nativity Scene

Sir Knight Ronald Ellis, Grand Generalissimo, chaired a committee to erect a Nativity Scene at the Masonic Home in Franklin. Through Ron's efforts and the generosity of the Brothers, Companions, and Sir Knights of Indiana figurines were purchased and a stable was erected. At times through out the Holiday season the figurines were replaced with volunteers dressed in costumes also made possible by the committee. The building, costumes, and statues will be a part of the Home's Christmas display for many years.

SERVICES

The services of the Grand Commandery can be viewed in two manners; one is the assistance provided, the second is the lack of demands made upon the Constituent Commanderies by the Grand Commandery. Over the last year we have attempted to provide service in both areas.

• Information Technology Committee

This committee was charged with providing recommendations to the Grand Commandery on using the latest technology to disseminate information. Most of this it's first year was spent examining the various way in which information can be transferred. However, we have made some initial steps in electronic forms for reports, and information sharing via our web site.

• Templar Education Committee

This committee is to provide leadership, history, customs, and practices training and education to all Sir Knights in Indiana. Programs such as the Indiana Templar Academies will be under the guidance of the committee.

• Instructionals

The Grand Commandery Officers visited each Battalion this year to instruct the Sir Knights in local Commanderies on the Tactics of the Order of The Temple. The schooling was informal and stressed participation rather than observation. The Instructionals were well received by those who attended, and many Sir Knights expressed their gratitude that the Grand Commandery was interested in helping the Constituent Commanderies portray quality Orders.

• York Rite Festivals

Our Grand Master's Classes are membership opportunities we provide to our Constituent Commanderies for candidates who do not have time or the Commandery is not ritualistic proficient. This year Grand Master VanGordon requested that the York Rite Degrees and Orders be held at six different sites around the state. This brought the work even closer to home for candidates, and also required the participation of more Companions and Sir Knights.

PRICE

Although the price of much of a Sir Knight's equipment can be expensive it is relatively inexpensive when compared to the value that Templary can offer to our members. As long as we continue to improve our products, quality, and service price will not be an issue to our continued success.

The real value Templary offers is the fellowship of it members, and the only way this value can be realized is through the price of participation.

NECROLOGY

Sir Knights are especially aware that we are born to die, but the reality of death still saddens the ranks. Although our fallen comrades no longer walk among us their light still shines, and our memories of them will continue forever. We extend our heartfelt sympathies to their families, and pledge to them that they shall not want for the necessities of life as long as our abilities enable us to provide them.

A complete report by the Necrology committee will be given in memory of our departed Sir Knights during this Conclave.

INSPECTIONS / INSTRUCTIONALS

Over the years the quality of our Ritual and Tactics has deteriorated to such a low level at many Commanderies it was decided to attempt to provide voluntary training rather than force Commanderies to perform Inspections. Consequently, traditional Commandery Inspections were optional this year, and were replaced by Instructionals for those Commanderies not wishing to conduct an Inspection. It is our hope that after multiple years of providing Instructionals to our Commanderies that the level of proficiency returns to a standard that we will be proud of the work portrayed.

RECEPTIONS

On Saturday, June 8, 2003 E. H. Gary Commandery hosted a reception for the Grand Commander at US Steel's Supervisors Club in Hobart, Indiana. The menu was the Grand Commander's favorite banquet fare consisting of: sauerkraut, Polish sausage, roast beef, chicken, and mashed potatoes.

The York Rite Reception for the Grand High Priest, Grand Most Illustrious Master, and Grand Commander was held at the Marriott Hotel in Indianapolis on June 15.

SUMMER MEETING

The annual Summer Meeting was held on Saturday, August 3, 2003 at the Radisson Hotel and Convention Center in Merrillville, Indiana. Besides the traditional committee reports break out

sessions considering three different topics were held with a subsequent report back to the general session. The topics considered during the break out sessions were;

- The Grand Master has charged us with increasing Masonic membership. What can we do to attract non-Masons into Templary?
- The state of our charities; are we successful with our current charities? Do we have too many charities?
- What can we do to help our Commanderies survive? (Membership alone is not an acceptable answer)

The discussions were lively, relevant, and informative. The results were deferred to the pertinent committees where they are being developed into action plans for implementation.

WINTER MEETING

Our Winter Meeting was held on Saturday, January 4, 2003 at the Marriot Hotel in Indianapolis, Indiana. The majority of the committees submitted preprinted reports for this meeting creating time for topics of relevance to be explored through general discussion. Among those topics were publicity, membership, and inspections. The Battalion Commanders were also asked to identify at least one problem existing in their Battalion, and propose a solution.

Following the general assembly a joint meeting of the Jurisprudence and Executive Committees was held to receive the Deputy Grand Commander's plans for the 2003 — 2004 Templar Year.

NEWBY - AVERY BANQUET

The 104th Annual Newby — Avery Banquet was held Saturday, January 4, 2003 at Marriot Hotel in Indianapolis, Indiana. This formal banquet is to recognize two of Indiana's most outstanding Sir Knights and Past Most Eminent Grand Masters of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar, Sir Knight Leonidas Perry Newby and Willard Meredith Avery.

This year's banquet was very well attend by representatives from many Masonic bodies including; the Grand Lodge, Grand Encampment, General Grand Chapter, Grand Chapter, Grand Council, Grand Commandery, and Scottish Rite. Roger S. VanGorden Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Indiana delivered the final remarks for the evening.

EAST CENTRAL DEPARTMENT CONFERENCE

Most Eminent Grand Master William Jackson Jones through Department Commander Donald M. Estes called the 2003 East Central Department Conference. The conference was held at the Marriott Griffin Gate Resort in Lexington, Kentucky on March 7 & 8, 2003. The conference included presentations on membership, Commandery survivability, and the upcoming Triennial in St. Louis.

An undertaking of this size requires the participation and cooperation of virtually every active York Rite Mason in Indiana. On March 15, 2003 a total of eighty four (84) new Sir Knights were created at

Anderson, Highland, Terre Haute, Evansville, Fort Wayne, and New Albany. Congratulations to all of the Companions and Sir Knights who rose to the challenge, and made this year's York Rite Class in honor of Grand Master VanGorden a success. Hopefully, the remembrance of this success from the Grand Master's vision we will continue to strive for higher goals.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS OF TEMPLAR OF INDIANA NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS March 31, 2003

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana are listed below:

- (a) For the purposes of these statements, the organization considers all short-term debt securities purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.
- (b) Assets and liabilities and revenues and expenses are recognized on the cash basis of accounting. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles generally accepted in the U.S. in that revenues are recorded when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred.
- (c) Investments The organization adopted the Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations." The provisions of the new standard require that investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities be measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. The unrealized gain on investment is reflected in the statement of activities. The effect of this change was immaterial.
- (d) Equipment is expensed when purchased, or if donated, a fair market value is expensed as of the date of the gift.
- (e) The organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donation. When a stipulation is not fulfilled, the organization returns the donation to the donor. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.
- (f) The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
- (g) The Commandery adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements for Not-for-Profit Organizations." Under SFAS No. 117, the Commandery is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted. In addition, the Commandery is required to present a statement of cash flow

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS

The organization has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be tax exempt under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code and not determined to be a private foundation.

GRAND INSPECTOR GENERAL'S REPORT

To the Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Indiana:

It has been an honor and pleasure to serve the Grand Commander as the Inspector General for the Grand Commandery for 2002-2003.

Instructionals were allowed this past inspection period in lieu of having inspections. Several of the Commanderies decided to have the instructional. The instructionals were held on the battalion level, with two to six Commanderies attending. Those who attended seemed very pleased about it and we received several good remarks.

The instructional was given more on tactics and not ritual. Covered was forming escort, sword manual, when to draw swords and how to draw, present arch of steel, etc. Also covered were how the guard was formed, escort formed and how hermits received the pilgrim. All of these were instructions for the Order of the Temple.

It was also stressed that when the East vacated their station the West should vacate theirs also, except the Warder.

We tried to have different Sir Knights take the different stations so they could learn what to do in case they ever sat there. As a side note, one Sir Knight who has been a Knight Templar for several years so stated, "I've been going to meetings for 35 years and this is the best one I've seen".

I asked another Sir Knight if he would like to sit in a station and he replied," I didn't get up early this morning to sit and watch". Needless to say it brought a lot of smiles to a lot of faces.

It gave the Grand Commander and me great pleasure to have Sir Knights come up to us after the session and thank us for doing the instructional and tell us how much they learned and would like to see it continued.

My personal opinion is that it is a good idea as long as the Commandery involved doesn't take the instructional as a way out of avoiding an annual inspection.

When a Commandery wishes to have an instructional, I personally feel that more officers should attend.

It was stressed that if a Commandery feels that they need help in doing any of the orders, let the Battalion Commander know, so you can do the work. Don't be afraid to ask for HELP.

REPORT OF MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana:

Your Membership Committee has been communicating on a regular basis all year, in person and on the internet. We are working our way through creating the membership pin for our members with cap and mantels. The completed pin should be here for the Grand Session in April 2003. Past Grand Commander Paul Friend should be commended for all of his fine efforts with this project.

Additionally we are working on a one and five year membership plan. Discussions have been continuing to find the correct direction to recommend to our Indiana Grand Commandery. This is not a small project and will need much more time and effort to develop over the next year or so. One main common direction seems to be within most of our minds; "local level membership action". The membership committee believes the local Commanderies need tools to react within our Masonic lodges. Those "tools" will need to be developed in the near future.

The Membership Committee has implemented the following this year:

Supplied York Rite and Knights Templar pamphlets to membership committees within other Groups Created and manned table top presentations at many Grand Lodge functions, Summer Festival at Franklin, IN, Scottish Rite and Shrine events.

Designed and Completed a Membership Pin.

Below are our ideas we recommended at the Summer and Winter Meeting. They still stand as a current idea guide line for our Templar membership success. We hope you will consider each idea or item and implement them as you see fit with your 2002-03 agenda.

Recommendations from the 2003 Summer Meeting:

A renewal in membership seems obtainable if the Grand Commandery of Indiana is successful in motivating its Officers, Past Officers, DBCs, local Commanderies along with the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons and the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons to embrace this program. The time could be right to capture the Masonic public eye with the renewal of our established ideals since September 11, 2001.

A past three year list of the Membership Committee's Reports has been reviewed and we have developed this report/plan for your acceptance. We suggest the Grand Commandery of Indiana adopt the following for membership development:

- 1. The Grand Commandery of Indiana needs to take a leadership role within the State York Rite or, by itself if needed, to succeed in this membership campaign. Work or lead in an effort to publicize who and what we are at Grand Lodge functions around the State of Indiana: Table top displays at Founder's Day, Indiana Masonic Home Pilgrimage, Grand Lodge membership classes and all Area Conferees. Do not miss any opportunity to display our program.
- 2. Incorporate Ron Ellis's 4 point program to increase inactive member's participation. This could bring the inactive member back to the meetings and activities. This could also reduce demits, and this inactive member may bring in his friends and neighbors.
- 3. Prepare and design a "Five Year Plan" to increase membership. This plan could be revised each year by each new Grand Commander. This plan could also give continuity to an on going plan or direction. Advertise in the public eye. The public relations committee should be allowed to develop a long range plan to bring the idea of Templarism to the public eye. Newspapers, radio and maybe television could

be utilized for success. Most citizens do not know who we are, let alone the Masonic population of Indiana.

- 4. Promote the membership cord and the new membership pin to our members. Our Sir Knights love to wear regalia on their uniforms.
- 5. Promote the State York Rite Slide Show and Lodge Visitation Program or Outreach for Master Masons. This is where we need to place our largest effort. The only place to obtain future members is within our Symbolic Lodges. Last year, we saw the start of an organized program to visit our lodges. These two programs need to continue and reward Commanderies for their success. Most lodge members do not know who we are. We need and should educate our Masonic brothers about what they are missing. We need to discuss developing a power point program just for the Knights Templar. 6. Work with Grand Encampment to develop a shortened version of our ritual for large membership classes. It has been proven that it does not make any difference how we bring in a member. He will
- 7. Develop a new handout and display for the Symbolic Lodges. Develop committees to maintain these displays around the state.
- 8. Implement a two fold plan to reduce the loss of membership through demits. 1. Reduce demits by making personal contact with members behind on dues payment and/or develop a continuous communication link with all members (newsletters, phone calls, etc.) and 2. All Commanderies in Indiana compile a list of demitted members then make a personal contacts with each on to encourage them to reinstate.
- 9. Give your DBC's a job with membership development. They will jump at the chance to help, just try it.
- 10. Incorporate the Grand Encampment Membership Program for 5/50 in your local Commandery. For every 100 members on your current roster, have a goal to add "5" new members each year. Reduce our losses by "50% "for those lost by demits and suspensions.
- 11. Plan and organize a list of good proven activities for each Commandery to think about and plan into their Commandery year. Good activities will bring in new and old members.
- 12. Create a program to bring men into the Masons as an E.A. and mentoring him until he becomes a Knights Templar.
- 13. Support the Grand Master's York Rite Classes on March 15, 2003 at six sites around Indiana.
- 14. Develop a poster contest between Commanderies and have the wining poster printed and distributed to each Commandery for use in public places. Supply a trophy to the winning Commandery. If membership is to be successful it is up to YOU and this Grand Commandery. You are the Templar leaders. The Commanderies are waiting for your lead.

As Paul W. Friend has said "If it is to be, it is up to ME". May God bless our endeavors!

- 1. There is currently an excellent program sponsored by Grand Commandery that recognizes the accomplishment of Sir Knights who have brought new members into York Rite Masonry, the Membership Cord program. While the colored shoulder loop cords reflect the various levels of recruiting on the Templar Uniform, there is no alternative means of recognition for Sir Knights not in uniform. The Membership Committee, in conjunction with the Templar Uniform Committee, has developed and adopted a pin or metal device with an attached membership level ribbon that may be worn on a civilian sport or suit coat. This award is expected to be available at the April 2003 Grand Conclave.
- 2. Grand Commandery appointive officers have, in the past, worn the uniform of the position they have formerly held. Over the past several years these officers have been permitted to wear a mixed uniform of local and Grand Commandery items. For 2003-2004, the appointive officers will be permitted to wear any uniform to which they are entitled, including the Grand Commandery Officer's uniform; however, the uniform selected must be worn in pure form as stipulated in our regulations.

In January, I received information from the American Academy of Ophthalmology concerning the Seniors Eye Care Program. The Knights Templar Eye Foundation and the American Academy of Ophthalmology are co-sponsors of the program. It provides access to medical eye care with no out-of-pocket expense to qualified US citizens over 65 who have not seen an ophthalmologist in 3 years and do not have insurance through an HMO or the VA.

The Academy provided a sample letter to the editor for us to inform the citizens of Indiana of the benefits of the program. The sample letter was forwarded to the Battalion Commanders, and they were asked to give them to the Commanderies with the intention that they should publish them in the local newspapers. Columbus Commandery No. 14 published the letter in The Republic and the results were surprising. One of the readers called the toll free number for the helpline (800-222-EYES) and scheduled eye exams for her parents. She was so impressed with the service that she intends to publish the letter in a Kentucky newspaper.

We could not pass up this opportunity for the Knights Templar to gain favorable publicity in the local community and provide a valuable service.

In the future, the Academy will furnish us with printed material and a PowerPoint presentation for us to use.

REPORT OF THE SESQUICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana

The Grand Commandery will observe its 150th year of existence in the year 2004. The Sesquicentennial committee has met over the past three years to make detailed plans for appropriate activities.

A historical book of the Grand Commandery of Indiana will be developed and edited by Bill Bissey, with the guidance of the committee. It will include an historical summary of the Grand Commandery from its' chartering, including a summary of the Past Grand Officers, Constituent Commandery growth, and other significant activities. Constituent Commanderies have had a chance to purchase an ad in the historical books, with information about their Commandery. The cut off date of data will be as of the 2003 Grand Conclave with the book ready for printing before the end of the year 2003.

A Grand Commandery Coat of Arms, that was utilized by the Grand Commandery in its' early existence, will be reproduced into a badge. Two kinds of badges will be made including: 1) Numbered badges from I to 150; and 2) and at least 150 unnumbered badges. The guidelines for ordering the numbered badges include having Constituent Commanderies having first choice to order the number of their current Commandery and Past Grand Commanders and current Grand line officers having first choice to order the number of their sequence in serving as Grand Commander. The orders for other numbered badges will be selected by guidelines developed by the committee. One person may order a maximum of two numbered badges. The deadline for ordering the numbered badges is September 1, 2003. If a total of at least 150 numbered badges are ordered from 150 different individuals, the maximum one person can receive is one. An individual can order an unlimited number of unnumbered badges.

Order forms for the historical book and badges are available during the 2003 Conclave. All orders must be accompanied by payment and sent to Duane L. Vaught, P.G.C.

George Ingles will be working with Trinity Commandery #62 and Raper Commandery #1 on a procedure to collect and exhibit items of historical interest. Individuals may exhibit items they have in their personal collections or Commanderies may exhibit items of interest from their Asylums. A guarded room will be opened for the displays during the 2004 Conclave.

There will be other planned activities for the year 2004, and we hope that Indiana Sir Knight's will assist the committee in anticipating and celebrating this historical event.


Within the Publicity Committee, we have split out several areas of particular interest where we would like to develop the concept further.


CONCEPT 1: Poster Contest

Purpose: To provide a visual depiction of what the Knights Templars stand for. These posters would be put in lodge halls all across Indiana and would draw potential brethren to our Order.

Focus: Accept various poster ideas from anywhere or anyone, who will submit them for consideration. We are looking for ideas that depict the some of the characteristics of Knight Templary

Examples:





Costs: Costs were to be \$1.00 per poster for reproduction (minimum 500). Each Blue Lodge would be given one (11X16) poster to hang with extras available at \$2.50.

Outcome: We solicited many of our Sir Knights but failed to receive any design responses except for Pat Diller (left) and Ron Ellis (right) (shown above). There was a consensus that this is still a good idea, but it will take some continuing work.

<u>Recommendation:</u> We now need to contact as many Sir Knights as possible for ideas and input. We may also be able to tie this poster creation to a public relations program we are submitting

in CONCEPT 3 below. And upon approval of this committee, we will have 500 posters printed and distributed throughout Indiana.

CONCEPT 2: Video Production

Idea: To produce a video that could be shown at various types of Masonic meetings that would target every Christian Mason by depicting or explaining what Templary is about and why they should join.

Focus: We would want to focus on a video (DVD) that would interest Masons in the York Rite and Knights Templar ultimately. We could show some of the history of the Knights Templar or Knights of the Temple and bring the story to present emphasizing the Christian Order of Masonry, compelling every Christian Mason to become a Knight Templar.

Benefit: To cause every Knight Templar to be proud of their membership in the Commandery. To inspire them to carry the banner to their local lodges and their churches, causing a chain reaction of an increase in membership, causing more inspired Sir Knights, causing an increase in membership, causing more inspired Sir Knights, etc.

Cost: We discussed an initial budget of approximately \$3,000. After investigating the cost to do a 15-minute professional video (DVD) at \$7,500 - \$14,000, we decided to look elsewhere. We also had a quote of \$1,000 if we do all the filming and scriptwriting. We do not have the resources to do either right now.

Outcome: The Publicity Committee believes this is a good idea that requires a lot more work and some special resources. We have made inquires to Grand Encampment but they do not have anything like we want. They were very encouraging and offered assistance in videotaping the program with their equipment at no cost to us.

<u>Recommendation:</u> This concept should be forwarded to the long-range planning committee for analysis. The analysis should include:

- Content
- Costs
- Media
- Distribution

CONCEPT 3: Commandery Newsletters

Idea: Create an award for best Newsletter/Publication by a Commandery

General: First, we must qualify by saying that since most of the York Rite Bodies meet jointly or have common members, that a joint publication or a newsletter published by a Temple Association will be considered the same as one being sent out only by a Commandery.

Procedure:

1. Each Commandery should be encouraged to communicate at least four times per year with its membership.

2. To reinforce this recommendation, the activity sheet should reflect award points for this type of communication.

To further encourage this program, an annual award, in the form of a certificate could be presented to the Commandery having the most outstanding newsletter/publication.

Each Battalion Commander shall select the one publication in his Battalion that he feels is most outstanding. He will have examples of the items for further consideration and forward them to the Publicity Committee (30) thirty days prior to Grand Conclave.

The Publicity Committee will pick the top three from among those submitted and have them on display at the Grand Conclave. The Publicity Committee will see to it that awards are created and presented at the annual conclave.

Rules: The following points should be considered both by the Battalion Commanders and the Publicity Committee when determining selection for the awards.

While the publication should contain a schedule of events, it should not be confined to that.

- a. In light of the approaching 150th Anniversary of the Grand Commandery, consideration should be given to articles of a historical nature about the Commandery.
- b. Sir Knights who have made some mark either in Templary, other fraternal endeavors, or local or national recognitions can be highlighted.
- c. It would not be out of place to mention the passing of Sir Knights.
- d. If the technology were available, photos of 50-year presentations, etc. would be appropriate.
- e. Other articles of Masonic interest and education would round out an exemplary publication.

Outcome: We have included an area for communications on the Activities Sheet for 2002. To publish two (2) newsletters in the year, as defined above, will earn a Commandery 25 points. In addition, the Publicity Committee will be ready to receive and award certificates at the annual conclave this year.

Recommendation: We recommend that this become an annual award and become a permanent part of the activity sheet.

CONCEPT 4: Marketing Plan

Marketing Plan: We propose to develop a marketing plan to help "sell" Templary to our audience. There are four major points (4-P's) to developing a workable marketing plan:

- Product What is it and what are the benefits?
- Price What is the cost and the value?
- Promotion How do we promote its features and ideas and make it desirable?
- Place Where do we go to promote our ideas and who is our target audience? Lodges/Public

Product: We have a clear understanding of our product but seem to lack specifics to sell it correctly. We can "say" that every Christian Mason should be a Knights Templar but often cannot define why. We need some type of outline or pamphlet that would allow even the least proficient Sir Knight to discuss the features and benefits of Templary without compromising the details of our Order.

Price: In today's cost conscience society, people want value for their money. How do we define the value of our organization? We need some way to place an educational value on our Orders and tie them back to the fundamentals of Freemasonry (i.e. seeking further light thereby helping the candidate fulfill his Blue Lodge obligations). The actual cost in dollars is easily explained for initiatory fees, dues and uniform (as required).

Promotion: The promotion concept may be the most difficult to put our arms around. It involves defining our target audience and getting the message out to them. If we just targeted qualified Master Masons and got the message to them, we could flourish in the coming years. But how can we do this? We must set an example. (For sake of this discussion, a community may be a lodge, a group of lodges, a church or an entire town or city). We propose several easy promotional things to do:

- Get involved in the community thereby deriving recognition of our work.
- Perform some type of community service (i.e. blood drives, eye exams for children).
- Recognize and or reward community involvement.
- Make the community aware that we are here and doing something good.
- Lodge visitations!

Place: Here again we must try to define whom we are trying to reach. If we can be more public in our activities, then we may succeed in drawing more qualified people into Freemasonry and ultimately into Templary. If we are to target only Master Masons, then we must begin an unparalleled effort to help build the lodges back up and create relationships with their members. This can be done by signing up members through the Blue Lodge and bringing them through to the York Rite.

Outcome: The Publicity Committee has begun to contact several colleges in an attempt to find a couple of Marketing Majors that can create a marketing plan for us as a part of a marketing class project. We think we have many of the answers but lack in the execution area.

We believe we can find two students and a professor to mentor them for two \$500 scholarships. This committee recommends that we proceed with this program and the funding.

CONCEPT 5: Other Communication Ideas

Several other ideas were discussed at a much broader level. Consensus within the committee has focused us on the ideas defined above. Spreading us any thinner would keep us from getting anything done.

Publicity in Print: Although we have encouraged Commanderies to get their "news" in public print, we do not seem very effective in that area. In the future, we propose to write up a procedure to aid local Commanderies in building relationships with local print agencies.

Sponsorships: Form an alliance with a uniformed youth group outside the fraternity. This may be done by sponsoring a group such as, but not limited to, a Boy or Girl Scout Troop. We have discussed this somewhat and believe that our involvement should be limited to financial aid, as many of our own youth organizations need the same help also.

He could use some articles about Templary as well as can Pat Diller for the supplement. Several articles were submitted to Jim as well as the new drill instructions for Triennial. Jim can use articles and information of interest for posting.

Masonic Communication Vehicles: We have come up with a list of all (we know about) Masonic related publications in Indiana. We must now figure out a way to communicate with them in a timely manner so as to utilize them when we want to reach their audience.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TRUSTEES

To The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana:

The market value of the Permanent Fund of the Grand Commandery as of the latest available report (February 28, 2002) is \$262,097.85 as compared with a value of \$255,701.53 at March 31, 2002. This is an increase of \$6396.32 due primarily to the addition of \$5300.00 in contributions to the Newby-Avery Fellowship and Newby-Avery Chair programs. The total value of the fund still reflects the market problems of the past months but hopefully the next year will bring improved market conditions and values.

A positive aspect at this time is that the Finance Committee, in agreement with the Grand Recorder, has determined that no transfer from the Permanent Fund will be necessary to balance the 2002-03 Budget. A surplus in the General Fund balances built up in the past few years will be used to fund the coming year's budgetary needs.

The Life Membership Fund remains fully invested in Certificates of Deposit and will remain so at this time. Declining rates will affect future yields as reinvestment becomes necessary. The Trustees and the Life Membership Committee will be studying the situation for necessary changes in investment policy.

To: the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights:

Initially, the Committee members made recommendations of topics to be covered at the local level that would serve as an outline for the Battalion Commander. Three subjects emerged and they are as follows: Web-site, Indiana Supplement and mentoring.

Web-Site:

There are currently ten topics listed on the Knight Templar home page, but there is little information on Knights Templar history or awards. Other ideal resources are the Officers Handbook or DBC Handbook. Hosting a banquet, having a Templar Board, pin placement on the uniform, etc. are equally good topics. The next step will be to design the "slide" and post the material on the web-site.

Indiana Supplement:

The Indiana Supplement is a good forum for written short stories of the successes of award winning Commanderies and membership development award winners. All Sir Knights would have access to the information.

Mentoring:

Mentoring is an especially relevant topic for Battalion Commanders to present to their Battalions.

The committee recommends the following.

- On Knighting, each new Sir Knight should be assigned a mentor to answer any questions that he or his wife may have.
- The new Sir Knight should be given a new member packet including a Commandery calendar or newsletter, philanthropies, a brief history of the Commandery and information on the Conclaves, activities and officers.
- The mentor should personally invite the new Sir Knight to the next Conclave and get him involved in the activities and Orders.
- Senior officers should mentor junior officers in the Commandery. The Generalissimo should administer and monitor the mentors and oversee the membership development. In the time remaining in the Templar year, the preceding recommendations will be implemented.

Perhaps through intermarriage many were absorbed by the Hebrews and other conquerors. And the Israelis have no intention of leaving Palestine. This is likely to be the toughest dilemma of our new century, one that now figures into International War on Terrorism. LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

The committee met twice this past year and had numerous E-mail communications during this year.

The Committee discussed many topics concerning the future of the Grand Commandery with emphasis on Financial, Public Relations, Philanthropies and Education.

Financial: The Past Officers have done an excellent job in planning for the future of the Grand Commandery. With continued support of programs like the Newby Avery Foundation and careful investments, our investments will continue to improve. The revising of the Grand Recorder's office to more modern methods including a new copier, postage machine and the Internet have all contributed to the savings for the Grand Recorder's Office.

There appears to be no reason to increase per-capita for at least the next five years, but continued contributions and saving measures are needed to keep the Grand Commandery on track.

Public Relations: We discussed the possibility of the Grand Commandery hiring a publicity professional, who would give us an outsider's view of who should be targeted for membership, as well as how we should market the Commandery to those prospective members. Discussion was held to the possibility of giving scholarships for that purpose.

Philanthropies: The older the philanthropy, the less support. The Education foundation is used very little and has been around from the 1920s, Camp Crosley from the 1940s, Eye Foundation for the late 1950s and the Holy Land Pilgrimage from the 1980s. This past year, we asked for donations for the Nativity scene at the Masonic Home and the response was very well received. The Long Range Planning Committee recommends encouraging more local activity while maintaining our traditional charities.

Education: The Grand Lodge has a very good program to enrich the education of the membership in a one-day training session. The committee has looked at some way to further the education of the Grand Officers and discussed using Education loan assistance to that end.

The Templar Academy needs to be reworked and re-established in the future It should not to be used as an alternative to the Grand Lodge program but more in tune with the Commandery Officer's, duties in the Commandery.

ANNUAL INSPECTION OF CONSTITUENT COMMANDERIES

General Order No. 1 — Conquest 2002-2003

May 3, 2002

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 473 and 474 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of this Jurisdiction be inspected.
- 2. Each Commandery shall be inspected by its respective Battalion Commander, except as follows: The designated primary Commandery of each Grand Officer excluding the Grand Prelate, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, Grand Inspector General and Grand Organist will be inspected by the Grand Inspector General. Other exceptions or substitutions may be made as authorized by the Grand Commander.
- 3. The Inspection shall consist of a report on the Commandery's membership efforts, examination of the books, records, accounts, paraphernalia, and properties of the Commandery. To complete their Inspection the Commandery shall perform OPTION 1, or participate in OPTION 2.
- 4. No Inspection will be considered complete until all books and financial records have been made available to the Inspecting Officer. If not available at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the Officer involved (Recorder or Treasurer) to deliver the same to the Inspecting Officer within fifteen (15) days. Failure to do so may cause the Commandery to be placed on probation until this obligation has been fulfilled.
- 5. The Inspecting Officer shall make his report of each inspection to the Grand Inspector General, Deputy Grand Commander, the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the Commandery inspected.
- 6. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each battalion on the activity score sheet will also be recognized by a ribbon that may be attached to the Commandery Beauceant. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.
- 7. Each Grand Officer excluding the Grand Prelate, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, Grand Inspector General and Grand Organist shall be authorized to open or close a Commandery in ample form on such occasions, as he may consider appropriate. The authorization to do so rests exclusively with the highest ranking such officer present.

OPTION 1

- A. Each Commandery shall open a Commandery of Knights Templar in Full Form, receive and present such Distinguished Guests as may be present, conduct the Rehearsal of Duties, and confer the Order of the Red Cross, Order of Malta or Order of the Temple. Conferring the Order upon an actual candidate is encouraged, as are open inspections, and banquettes.
- B. The full form Opening and the coia1ring of the Order shall be in accordance with the Ritual and Official Indiana Asylum Tactics, and the most recent official interpretations thereof. The Twelve Man Full Form opening or the Ten Man Officer opening may be used.
- C. All of the Officers of the Commandery are required to attend the Inspection unless for reasons of illness, work or family.
- D. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers or other members of the Commandery fill die officers stations during the inspection. If necessary, a limited number of officers and members from another Commandery may assume the stations. If an actual candidate is present the quality of the impression made upon such candidate shall be of prime importance.
- E. Each Inspection shall start promptly on the date and time mutually agreed upon with the respective Battalion Commander. The date and time may not be changed after the Official Inspection Schedule has been approved except by a special dispensation issued by the Grand Commander.
- F. Upon completion of each Order, the Inspecting Officer shall give his remarks first and then the Grand Commander, if present, shall be called upon for any remarks that he might wish to make. At all times if the Grand Commander is not present, then the Inspection Officer shall act as his Official Representative and shall be accorded all of the honors and courtesies due him as such. If the Grand Commander is present, he will be the final speaker unless the Most Worshipful Grand Master is in attendance in which case the Grand Master will be the final
- G. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the score of the opening and closing combined with that of the Order conferred. All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose. A full report of the inspection will be published and appropriate recognition given at the Annual Conclave.

OPTION 2

- A. Those Commanderies not volunteering to perform a Full Form Opening and Order will participate in a Battalion Instructional, which will be organized by the Battalion Commander, and under the direction of the Grand Inspector General.
- B. All of the Officers of the Commandery are required to attend the Instructional unless for reasons of illness, work or Family.
- C. All of the Sir Knights of the Commandery, particularly newly created Sir Knights, are encouraged to attend the Instructional.

This Order shall be read in all Constituent Commanderies at the first Stated Conclave following its receipt and so noted in the minutes of the Commandery.

148TH CONCLAVE DIGEST

The 148th Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Indiana, was held at the Marriott Hotel, Indianapolis. The Sir Knights of Crawfordsville Commandery #25, the home Commandery of the R., E. Grand Commander, served as hosts for the Conclave.

The lines were formed by the Deputy Battalion Commanders and Knights of Crawfordsville Commandery, under the direction of S.K. Leon G. Weber as Captain. Distinguished guests were received under the guidance of S.K.'s Steven J. Barton, K.C.T., P.G.C., and Dwight E. Lanman, Jr., K.C.T., P.G.C. Inspecting officer was S.K. William Jackson Jones, Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, of the United States of America. Also present was S.K. Donald M. Estes, R.E. Department Commander of the East Central Department. in addition, S.K. David Dixon Goodwin, R.E. Department Commander of the Northeast Department and S.K. Willard R. Clutter, K.C.T., R.E. Department Commander of Subordinate Commanderies were present. James S. DeMond, K.G.G., and Past Department Commander, as well as S.K.'s Robert E. Price, K.G.C., R. Frank Williams, K.C.T., were in attendance. S.K. Roger S. VanGordon, Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana, represented Richard W. Wierzba, M. W. Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana and took an active part in all of the proceedings. The colors were presented by the officers In the West and all present participated in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call of Grand Representatives showed that 36 were present, 4 absent, 5 were excused, and 4 are vacant. The Report of the Necrology Committee paid tribute to those 195 Sir Knights who have passed to their eternal rest during 2001, including William A. Pruitt, Deputy Grand Commander. Sir Knight Pruitt was eulogized by Past Grand Commander Henry E. LaHurreau. The Grand Recorder reported a loss of 167 for the year 2001 with 174 new Sir Knights having been created.

The Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee reported that no Indiana Pastors had been given the opportunity to visit the Holy Land during the past year, due to the unrest in the area. A total of 164 Indiana Pastors have participated in the program. The Camp Crosley Committee reported that 20 boys and girls attended Camp Crosley in 2001 as guests of the Commanderies of Indiana. The Educational Loan Foundation Committee reported that 1 loans of \$3,000.00 was made during the year and that total loans outstanding totaled \$85,306.67 at years end. A continuing shortage of applicants has curtailed the lending, even though allowable loans were raised to \$3,000.00 per year or a total of \$6,000.00 per applicant.

The official Conclave Program Book, now entitled The Templar Crusader, was again made available to those present, and a donation will be made to the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee and the Camp Crosley program when all monies have been received. A total of thirty-four persons traveled from Indiana to attend the Easter Sunrise Pilgrimage in Washington, D.C., and the Indiana Sir Knights, joined by a number of others, including the M. E. Grand Master, again placed a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington Cemetery.

The final report of the Credentials Committee showed that all Commanderies were represented by at least one delegate, except Valparaiso No. 28, who did not have a representative at the Conclave. Following this report, the election was held with the following results:

- 1. Appoint a Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee. (Suggestion: Commander, Prelate and one other Sir Knight.)
- 2. Any Sir Knight in good standing, may submit to this Committee a nomination of any full time Christian Minister.
- 3. This Committee will recommend to the Commandery one Minister to be nominated by the Commandery and the Commandery will vote to accept or reject the recommendation.
- 4. After a Minister is nominated by the Commandery, the Committee should meet with that Minister and fill out the form 'Questionnaire for Ministers'. The form should be signed by the Minister and also signed by the Commander or Committee Chairman.
- 5. On or before OCTOBER 1, 2001 send the completed form to: S.K. R. Frank Williams, PGC, GPE, HDC, Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Indiana. A letter supporting the Nomination may be submitted.
- 6. The Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee of the Grand Commandery, consisting of the Grand Prelate and Former Grand Prelates will receive, shortly after November 15, a copy of the Nomination forms along with a ballot. After prayerful consideration, having marked their ballot as to their selection, the ballots are tabulated and the decision rendered and announced.
- 7. Should a Minister nominated by your Commandery be selected, you will be notified. You're local Committee shall then call on the Minister selected and extend to them the formal invitation to be the Guest of the Grand Commandery for this inspirational and educational experience. - 10. The air fare for the Minister will be paid out of the funds received for their trip to Newark, N.J. under the Super Saver plan.
- 11. For reasons of Security, the Minister agrees that he shall not arrange any involvement with Political Factions in ISRAEL.

GRAND COMMANDER'S EASTER MESSAGE

To the Officers of the Grand Commandery, the Officers, Sir Knights and all of the families of the Constituent Commanderies of Knights Templar in the state of Indiana:

Easter Sunday, the most sacred Christian Holiday. is the culmination of a weeklong celebration of Jesus' life death, and resurrection. Holy week begins on the Sunday before Easter and is as follows:

Palm Sunday is celebrated on the Sunday before Easter Sunday. It recalls Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem one week before his crucifixion.

Holy Monday commemorates Jesus' cleansing of the temple when he assaulted moneychangers and overturned their tables. Some believe that this triggered his arrest and execution.

Holy Tuesday recalls Jesus' description to his disciples on the Mount of Olives of the destruction of Jerusalem.

Holy Wednesday recalls Judas decision to betray Jesus in exchange for 30 pieces of silver.

Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper, Jesus agony in the garden and his arrest.

Good Friday recalls Jesus' death on the cross. The origin of the word "good" has been lost. Some claim that it is a corruption of "God" and that the early Christians called this day "God's Friday." Others claim that "good" refers to the blessings of humanity that Christians believe arose as a result of Jesus' execution.

Holy Saturday is the final day of Holy Week and of Lent.

Easter Sunday commemorates Jesus' resurrection. In the early church, converts were baptized into church membership on this day after a lengthy period of instruction. This tradition continues today in some churches.

With all of the turmoil and uncertainty facing the world in these troubled times please reflect upon the teachings and sacrifices of our Savior.





INACTIVE AND RENAMED COMMANDERIES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

Greensburg #2 - Charter date September 1853. One of the three Commanderies who gathered in Indianapolis on May 16, 1854, to form the Grand Encampment (Commandery) of Indiana. In 1865, it was noted that no returns from #2 had been received since 1861. The Grand Commander reported that the Commandery was reorganized and located at Shelbyville. On April 4, 1866, the name was officially changed to Baldwin #2.

Cambridge City #6 - On April 8, 1868, the name of Connersville Commandery #6 was changed to Cambridge City #6. On April 30, 1884. This action was rescinded and both the location and name reverted to Connersville.

Bedford #7 - Charter date December 2, 1858. In the Proceedings of 1864, it is noted that the Charter was 'surrendered."

William Hacker #9 - Organized April 4, 1866. Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Knightstown #9 on April 28, 1874,

Warsaw #10 - Chartered April 7, 1868. Merged with Goshen #50 on October 14, 1995.

Thomas H. Lynch #14 - Chartered April 4, 1868. Name changed to Columbus #14 on April 28, 1874.

Dowling #16- Chartered April 8, 1868. Name changed to Terre Haute #16 on April 5, 1871.

Aurora #17 - Chartered April 7, 1869. Charter "annulled" May 9, 1929 revoked by action of Grand Commandery.

Marion #21 - Chartered April 5, 1871. Name changes to Grant County #21 on April 25, 1975.

Caleb Schmidlapp #22 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Madison #22 on April 1, 1873.

Franklin #23 - Chartered April 3, 1872. Name changed to Johnson County #23 on April 20, 1990.

Plymouth #26 - Chartered April 28, 1875. Charter surrendered September 11, 1974, and merged with South Bend #13.

Washington #33 - Chartered April 16. 1890. Charter surrendered July 14, 1985, and merged with Vincennes #20.

Cyrene #34 - Chartered May 2, 1891. Name changed to Columbia City #34 on May 9, 1947.

Columbia City #34 - Successor to Cyrene #34. Charter surrendered September 4, 1968.

Bluffton #38 - Chartered April 18, 1895. Chartered surrendered October 20, 1994, and merged with Fort Wayne #4

Delphi #40 - Chartered February 4, 1897. Charter surrendered December 11, 1972, and merged with Lafayette #3.

Princeton #46 - Chartered April 26, 1903. Charter surrendered April 22, 1995, and merged with LaValette #15.

Rushville #49 - Chartered May 11, 1905. Charter surrendered November 20, 1997, and merged with Connersville #6.

Mishawaka #51 - Chartered January 16, 1906. Charter surrendered March 1, 1973 and merged with South Bend #13.

Winchester #53 - Chartered July 18, 1906. Charter surrendered 1961 and merged with Muncie #18.

Sullivan #54 Chartered July 4, 1907. Charter surrendered September 20, 1979.

Martinsville #55 - Chartered April 14, 1908. Charter surrendered December 1, 1932.

Gary #57 - Chartered May 14, 1914. Name officially changed to Elbert H. Gary #57 at Annual Conclave on April 28, 1995.

Peru #60 - Chattered February 21, 1921. Charter surrendered December 1, 1989 and merged with Wabash #37.

DeMolay #62 - Chartered June 21, 1923. Name changed to Oriental #62 on May 12, 1941, Oriental #62 - Successor to DeMolay #62. At the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery in 1969, Oriental #62 petitioned the Grand Commandery to allow a change of location to the Irvington Masonic Temple in Indianapolis. This petition was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee and the Grand Commandery. In the 1970 Proceedings, the name appears as Trinity #62 but No record can be found in the Proceedings of the official change of name or of the approval of the change of By-Laws of this Commandery to change the name.

Trinity #62 - Charter was arrested by Grand Commander March 11, 1995. Members at that time were transferred into St. Anselm Commandery, U.D., pending final resolution of the future of the Commandery. On July 25, 1995, the charter was restored by the Grand Commander and the Commandery moved to another Indianapolis location, at Calvin Prather Lodge #717

Dwight L. Smith, U.D. - Dispensation issued July 13, 1996, to open Commandery at Salem. Dispensation returned April 24, 1998.

Crown Point, U.D. – Dispensation issued May 9, 2000, to open a Commandery at Crown Point. Dispensation returned April 25, 2003
