Warrant from W. B. Hubbard, General Grand Master of the General Grand Encampment, of the United States, to form a State Grand Encampment for the State of Indiana was dated at Columbus, Ohio, on April 24,1854.

The Grand Encampment (now Commandery) for the State of Indiana was formed and organized at Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 16, 1854, by the following four Commanderies: Raper No.1; Baldwin No. 2; Lafayette No. 3; and Fort Wayne No. 4.

SIR KNIGHT DAVID J. KUSSMAN, GCT MOST EMINENT GRAND MASTER, GRAND ENCAMPMENT KNIGHTS TEMPLAR, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Sir Knight David J. Kussman, was born in Houston, Texas, on Easter Sunday morning, April 5, 1953. His father, Frederick J. Kussman, Jr. was an active Mason in Texas and later in California. His mother, Hazel E. Kussman, was active in both the Order of Eastern Star and the Social Order of the Beauceant, serving several times as President. Sir Knight Kussman is a graduate of Loara High School in Anaheim, California, and attended Fullerton College and August Vollemer University majoring in Criminal Justice. He received his teaching credential from the University of California in Los Angeles. He completed his ministry studies at Cottonwood Leadership College, School of Ministry and Leadership. Sir Knight Kussman was ordained in 2011 and has served as an associate pastor at Plaza Bible Church in Anaheim and Catch the Flame Ministries, Inc. Sir Knight Kussman is a retired Police Sergeant from the Anaheim Police Department, completing thirty-four years of service.

Sir Knight Kussman was married to Lady Kimberly Ann (Schmidt) Kussman from 1988 until her passing in 2015. They were blessed with three children, two daughters and a son.

His family currently now consists of six grandchildren: three boys and three girls. Sir Knight Kussman met Lady Kimberly J. Burnett, PSWP, CT, of Columbus, Ohio at the 67th Triennial in Indiana. Ms. Burnett has served as Supreme Worthy President of the Supreme Assembly of the Social Order of the Beauceant. Their friendship has blossomed into a loving relationship and Ms. Burnett will be travelling with Sir Knight Kussman as often as her busy schedule permits.

In the Symbolic Craft Lodge, Brother Kussman was Initiated, Passed and Raised in Mother Colony Lodge No. 750, Free and Accepted Masons of California in 1979. In 1991, Mother Colony Lodge No. 750 and La Miranda Lodge No. 778 consolidated and became La Mirada Lodge No. 750 with Brother Kussman serving as the Worshipful Master. He transferred his membership to Anaheim Lodge No. 207 as an affiliated Past Master. Brother Kussman is also a member of the Southern California Research Lodge and the Southern California Past Master's Association.

In York Rite, Capitular Masonry, Companion Kussman was Exalted in Fullerton Chapter No. 90, Royal Arch Masons, where he served as High Priest in 1987. He was Consecrated in the Order of High Priesthood, served as an Inspector for the Grand Chapter of California, and decorated with the Grand Chapter Meritorious Service Award and Grand High Priest's Distinguished Service Medal.

In York Rite, Cryptic Masonry, Companion Kussman was Greeted in Santa Ana Council No. 14, Cryptic Masons, where he served as Illustrious Master in 1997. He received the Order of the Silver Trowel and served this body as Thrice Illustrious Master. He served the Grand Council as an Inspector and Assistant Director of Ritual. Companion Kussman was decorated with the Grand Master of Ish Sodi Award from the Grand Council and is a Companion of the Secret Vault within the Order of the Secret Vault of the General Grand Council Cryptic Masons International.

In York Rite, Chivalric Masonry, Sir Knight Kussman was Knighted in Fullerton Commandery No. 55, Knights Templar, where he served as Commander in 1986 and 1987. Ordained a member of the Past Commander's Association serving as both Virtual Prior and Actual Prior. He served the Grand Commandery as Inspector and Assistant Director of Ritual. He also served as a member of the Drill Team Committee, serving on three different drill teams. He was honored after seventeen years as Drill Captain Emeritus form Orange County Commandery No. 36. Sir Knight Kussman received the Knight Templar Meritorious Award twice from the Grand Commandery of California and decorated with the Knights Templar Cross of Honor in 2005. Sir Knight Kussman was appointed to the Grand Commandery line in 2002 and served as Right Eminent Grand Commander in 2010-2011. During his term as Grand Commander, California hosted the first Grand Encampment Western States Easter Celebration in Los Angeles. For his efforts, the Grand Encampment Knights Templar, College of Honors, created him a Knight Commander of the Temple.

His service to the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the United States of America began in 2012, when Grand Master David Dixon Goodwin, GCT appointed him as the Southwestern Department Commander for the 66th Triennium. Sir Knight Kussman was elected Grand Captain General for the 67th Triennium and decorated with the Knight Grand Cross of the Temple. He was elected Grand Generalissimo for the 68th Triennium. In August 2021, Sir Knight Kussman was elected Deputy Grand Master. Sir Knight Kussman is a member of The Sovereign Order of Knights Preceptor. Ordained a Knight Priest in St. John the Baptist Tabernacle No. LXVI, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, where he served as Preceptor and Registrar. He holds the title of Knight Commander in the Order. He served the Grand College of America, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, twice as Grand Chaplain and is currently serving as Grand First Pillar.

In the York Rite College, Companion Knight Kussman was Initiated into Southern California York Rite College No. 110 and served as Governor in 2005. He was elevated to the Rank of Associate Regent (Order of the Purple Cross). Knight Companion Kussman served the York Rite Sovereign College of North America as Deputy Grand Governor and as Grand Governor of California.

Sir Knight Kussman is a Life Member of Los Angeles Priory No. 27 and Sierra Pacific Priory No. 71, where he served as Prior. Sir Knight was coronated a Knight York Grand Cross of Honor with one quadrant by the Convent General Knights of York Cross of Honor.

He received the degrees of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry in the Valley of Santa Ana, Orient of California. He is a Past Venerable Master of the Orange County Lodge of Perfection and Past Commander of Orange County Council of Knights of Kadosh. He served his Valley for ten years as Chaplain, and on the Investments Committee. Invested with the Rank and Decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour and Coroneted a 33° Inspector General Honorary. Created a Noble in Al Malaikah Temple, Oasis of California, now a member of El Bekal Temple.

In the invitational Masonic orders:

Installed a Knight Companion in St. Croix Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine, where he served as Sovereign. Is currently serving the United Grand Imperial Council as Intendant General for the Division of California- Southern. Received and Admitted in California College, Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, and holds honorary memberships Golden State College and Concordia College. He has received his IX° Grade, having served the High Council as Chief Adept for the three Colleges in California. He is currently serving as High Prelate and Deputy Treasurer General. Cousin Kussman is a Past Excellent Chief of Brian Boru Council No. 38 Knight Masons and was honored with the Order of Brian's Harp. He served the High Council Knight Masons of the United States of America as a Superintendent for California. Charter Member of Signet Council No. 230, Allied Masonic Degrees, where he served as Sovereign Master, and is a recipient of the Red Branch of Eri. Appointed to the progressive line of officers of the Grand Council Allied Masonic Degrees serving currently as Junior Grand Deacon. Awarded the Knight Grand Cross of the Red Branch of Eri. Recipient of the 4th Grade in the Ancient and Masonic Order of the Scarlet Cord. Advanced and Promoted a Knight Companion of the Royal Order of Scotland in the Provincial Grand Lodge of the United States of America. Charter member of Lone Star Chapel No. 45 and a member of Trinity Chapel No. 12, Commemorative Order of St. Thomas of Acon. Initiated into Santa Ana/El Toro Chapter No 250, and Camp William Biehl, Heroes of '76, serving as Chapter President and Camp Commander. Currently serving as Chaplain. Dual Membership with Joseph H. Pendleton Chapter No. 243 and Pasadena Chapter No. 265.

Made a Fellow of the Grand College of Rites of the United States of America. Currently serving as Grand Chancellor of the Grand College awarded the Knight Grand Cross. On March 12, 2022, a special conclave of the Grand Encampment was convened at which time Sir Knight Kussman advanced by succession and was installed as the 61st Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar, USA.



INSPECTING OFFICER SIR KNIGHT DAVID W. STUDLEY, RIGHT EMINENT GRAND CAPTAIN GENERAL GRAND ENCAMPMENT, KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

David was born in Longview, Washington on February 2, 1948, Groundhog Day, a source of continued merriment for his family. David is the older of two brothers, sons of William and Verna Studley, now deceased. David graduated from R.A. Long High School in Longview in 1966, attended Pomona College in Claremont, CA, where David majored in Economics, receiving a B.A. Degree in 1970. David also lettered in football for the Pomona Fighting Sagehens, a NCAA Division 3 team (meaning not too impressive), earning All-League honors as a Tight End in his Junior and Senior seasons.

David enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in August 1970, attended basic training Page 8 of 135 at MCRD San Diego, and was transferred to Active Reserve status in February 1971. David was proud to have served our Country and the Corps during his six years of active reserve duty and was honorably discharged as a Staff Sergeant (E6) in 1976. Along the way, David was assigned for a summer to the staff of Lt. General Lewis Walt, Assistant Commandant of the Marine Corps, on the Presidential Clemency Commission David started law school at Santa Clara University in 1971, receiving a Juris Doctor Degree, summa cum laude, in May 1974. David passed the California Bar in November that year and began working at a midsized San Francisco law firm in December.

After 5 years general civil litigation experience, David joined the Law Department at Dean Witter, a national securities broker-dealer (now Morgan Stanley, a firm it acquired). David eventually rose to the position of Senior Vice President, in charge of litigation in the Western one-half of the United States. David was elected to the Business Conduct Committee of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc., and served as its Chair in the final year of his three-year term. Because David was assigned to teach senior Dean Witter executives about securities law for licensing examinations, David took and passed the General Securities exam and became a licensed stockbroker, although David never sold or recommended investments (so you're smart not to ask for tips).

David's Masonic experience began in 2005 in San Andreas, CA, a lodge near where he and his wife Hallie bought a second home in 1999. David was Master of the lodge for 3 years, and later an Inspector (a job he still holds). David joined the Scottish Rite in 2007 and soon thereafter the York Rite. David served as presiding officer of all 3 York Rite Bodies, some several times, and was admitted to the San Francisco and Golden West Priories of KYCH. As were many of you, David was invited to serve and actively participates in many invitational York Rite and Masonic bodies, including the Red Cross of Constantine, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, Royal Order of Scotland and Robert the Bruce Association, Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis, York Rite Sovereign College, Knight Masons, Allied Masonic Degrees, and National Sojourners. David holds or has held offices in many of those bodies. David is currently serving as the 163rd Grand Commander of Knights Templar of California.

It was Sir Knight David Studley's honor to be installed Grand Captain General at the Special Conclave of the Grand Encampment in Ft. Wayne, IN. David was elected a Trustee of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation at the Triennial in Indianapolis, IN in 2018 and continues to serve that impactful foundation.

David was married for 31 years to Hallie Matson, his loving and supportive spouse, who died of brain cancer in December 2020. Cancer is a pernicious disease, and we extend our heartful support to all those afflicted by this challenge and to their families.

David is blessed with two sons, Brian, who is 43 and lives in a group setting for handicapped adults, and Robert, 41, an attorney in San Francisco, CA. Robert is married to his lovely wife Sarah and they have given him two grandchildren to love, Eliana and Teddy, ages 8 and 6.

Sir Knight Trent was born in Dayton, Ohio and later moved to Mt. Vernon, Ohio where he graduated from high school. He was awarded Bachelors Degrees in Business Administration and Philosophy from Wittenberg University and he also holds a Masters Degree from the Air Force Institute of Technology.

He is active in the Springfield and Urbana York Rite bodies and is a Knight York Grand Cross of Honour, a Companion of the Secret Vault, and a Knight Commander of the Temple. He served the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Ohio as its Grand Commander in 2018-2019. Sir Knight Trent is also a member of the Tall Cedars, Eastern Star, Shrine, Allied Masonic Degrees, Order of Athelstan, Commemorative Order of St. Thomas of Acon, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, Red Cross of Constantine, and the Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis. He has been a DeMolay Advisor and is a recipient of the DeMolay Legion of Honor. Sir Knight Trent is also active in the York Rite College and has received the Order of the Purple Cross. Biography of Sir Knight Randal Ellington, GPE

Sir Knight Randal P. Ellington married to his Lady Dee on October 23rd 2018 and her family has an extensive Masonic background. He was born into a Masonic Family on May 31st, 1970 with his Father Carl being a Member of Cumberland Lodge #726 and his Sister Carla who is a Majority Member of Bethel #67 Job's Daughters and his Brother Roger who is a Senior DeMolay of Cumberland Chapter Order of DeMolay and my Mother Claudine who decided that it was more important that she just wanted to be a Mom and support her family with their Masonic and other endeavors, she did not belong to any Masonic Ladies Organizations but was very involved with the DeMolay Mother's Club and Scouting with both of her son's, Job's Daughters Bethel activities with her daughter Carla and also Home Extension Club, . When Randal turned 13, he was already a Boy Scout, his father and "Dad" Dale Herthel were coffee buddies and his father came home one day with a petition for DeMolay that was signed by Dale's son, Phil Herthel and was informed by his Father that was the way to go. Tolen, Past Grand Master and also a Senior DeMolay from William Hacker Chapter with his 50yr DeMolay pin at his installation. MWB Tolen was Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge in 1985. He then took a little time off from the Masonic Fraternity and then Farmers Lodge #147 and his mother read in the newspaper that a public meeting talking about re-forming the David Conger Chapter Order of DeMolay in Flat Rock was going to take place. He attended and met Senior DeMolay Roger S. VanGorden, PGM and Russell Hamner, Jr., Treasurer of Farmers Lodge #147 who knew his Father and several other Brothers. He was told by MWB VanGorden that he got to speak about DeMolay since he was the youngest in the group. After attempting to help reform the DeMolay Chapter by initiating members through Franklin Chapter and being involved for a while, he was then asked why he hadn't joined the Lodge by Brother Jeffery Beaver who's son Mike was one of the DeMolay's, he then asked for a petition and then proceeded to join the lodge where he took his Masonic Degree's in 2001. After a failed attempt to reform the David Conger DeMolay Chapter he became more involved with the Franklin Chapter Order of DeMolay and has served on the Advisory Council ever since. Once he joined Farmers Lodge #147 he served in his first office of Senior Deacon in 2002 and became Worshipful Master for the first time in 2005 and then again in 2015.

He has been very fortunate to serve as a twice Past Master, Past Secretary other also Offices and is Farmers Lodge #147's current Secretary. He then petitioned Shelby Chapter #20, Shelby Council #3 and Baldwin Commandery #2 where and took the York Rite Degree's and Order's in a 1 Day Class in 2002. He became active in all 3 York Rite Bodies and he is a Past Presiding Officer of all 3 York Rite Bodies of Shelby County and is currently serving as the Secretary and Recorder of his York Rite. He has been involved and has served the Grand Commandery as a Deputy Battalion Commander since 2005 and was honored to receive the Grand Commandery's Distinguished Service Award in 2005. He is also served Sir Knight Paul A. Cole, PGC as his Grand Prelate in 2011-2012 thereby becoming a Grand Prelate Emeritus and is also a member of the Baldwin Commandery #2 Drill Team.

Our DeMolay Chapter was named William Hacker Chapter Order of DeMolay after Sir Knight Hacker who was a Past Grand Commander of this Grand Commander, Past Illustrious Grand Master of the Grand Council, Past Most Excellent Hight Priest of the Grand Chapter and also a Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana and is known as a 4 Star Masonic General all of which was done in the 1800's, his sword is on the alter today.

MY RECOMMENDATIONS

1) I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue to hold at least three Indiana Templar Academies or leadership development classes, one in the North, one in the South and one in the Central and that the Grand Generalissimo be in charge of this education.

2) I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue to support the Job's Daughters, the Rainbow Girls and the DeMolay and raise the financial donation from \$250.00 (that has been the same amount for approximately 20years) to at least \$500.00 per organization. This, I support should be in the form of financial, visitation and participation by Grand Officers with the local Chapter's, Assembly's and Bethel's.

3) I recommend that the Elected Grand Officers meet with their counterparts of each of the Grand York Rite Bodies and plan a look to the future to join the Grand Chapter, Council and Commandery back together as a Whole for their Grand Sessions. This would support York Rite Unity and the betterment of the York Rite Craft as a Whole in Indiana. 4) I recommend that the Grand Commandery continue to support drill teams – either at individual Commanderies or on a Battalion Basis.

5) I recommend the continuance of the Ritual Competition and that this be supported by the Grand Commandery in order to better our Ritual.

6) I recommend that the Triennial Committee and the Grand Commandery continue to be financially supportive of the Sir Knights and Drill Teams who will be attending the 2024 Triennial and look towards the 2027 Triennial and look into the revision of the Grand Commandery Law regarding the Triennial.

7) I recommend that the Grand Commandery of Indiana needs to have a relationship with the Grand Chapter of the Order of Eastern Star since they make donations to benefit the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. The Eye Foundation committee and Campaign Chairman should be ready to make presentations to raise funds within the Districts of the Order of the Easter Star on behalf of the Eye Foundation. Appearing in uniform would be an asset and a recruiting tool.

8) I recommend that the Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander serve as a Mentor to the Grand Sentinel and assist in the mentoring of him in his duties for the insuring year.9) I recommend that the Committee on Membership continue with new ideas and innovations to increasing membership, retention and mentor programs

10) I recommend that the Website needs more improvement and updating with proper and up to date information and that the Communications Committee Chairman work with the Web-Master, Grand Commander and Grand Recorder to make updates.

11) I recommend that we do not lose sight of raising donations for the Holy Land Pilgrimage Fund, whether it be with the sale of Challenge Coin's, Templar Crusader Magazine Add's, Golf Outing or other Donations. This is a means to support Ministers as they make their trip to the Holy Land.

12) I recommend that each Commandery strive to become Life Members of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation.

13) I recommend that the Officers of the Grand Commandery continue the wearing of the Aprons that were donated to the Grand Commandery for the purpose of aligning our Non "Class A" Dress attire with not only the Officers Collar but also with an apron to be worn in meetings or in public while serving as a Grand Commandery Officer in allowing the Officers of the Grand Commandery to look more like Masons.

State of Indiana Templary

There are some very strong Commanderies in Indiana and a few that are still very weak. Having said that, the overall status of Templary in the State of Indiana in my estimation is good.

Why take the Leadership Training?

- 2. To Share in a Cumulative Experience Pool
- 3. To Holistically Improve Masonry
- 4.It is an Established Program
- 5. It has Premium Material
- 6.It provides Actionable Training

What is the York Rite Leadership Training Program?

The York Rite Leadership organization is a Center of Excellence that delivers executive-

class leadership training and coaching to all masonic leaders wherever dispersed. The current York Rite Leadership Training Program consists of three well-developed courses that are designed to give you the skills to be a better leader of yourself and others.

The three courses are: 100 – Personal Effectiveness 200 – Group Dynamics 400 – Influential Communication

These courses may be attended online (the x01 class) or in-person (the x02 class).

How do I earn the Leadership Award Coin?

The Leadership Award Coin is a prestigious symbol of your commitment to learning and practicing masonic leadership principles.

The coin is given out for completion of the in-person classes. These classes are held at various events and are designated as the x02 classes.

When you attend the 102 you will receive the *Personal Effectiveness* coin segment. Attending the 202 class will earn you the *Group Dynamics* coin segment and attending the 402 class will earn you the *Influential Communication* coin segment.

Online class completion does not earn a coin segment. You must attend an in-person class.

Who should consider this program?

Any member of the Masonic family may participate. We do ask that the youth be mature. For guidance, a young gentleman or lady who is between 14 and 18 and has a mature outlook may be admitted. Admission is always at the discretion of the instructor.

How is the Program structured?

The program consists of three (3) courses, which are titled *Personal Effectiveness* (100), *Group*

Dynamics (200), and *Influential Communication* (400). Each course is offered in an online (x01) and an in- person (x02) experience. The in-person classes are held at the Grand Encampment Department Conferences and other events by demand.

Graduation from the program means you have completed at least one class each course, either online or in- person for each course. Keep in mind that there is always more to learn, and you are welcome to repeat any of the classes when they are offered.

Will I receive a certification after completing this program?

You can print a completion certificate for yourself anytime upon completion of each class. How much does the program cost?

There is no cost for the class itself. If you are attending an in-person class at a conference, there may be a required for the conference. You will be responsible for registering for the conference and paying their fee paying for any meals you wish to have, and your hotel and travel expenses.

Stephen Paul Kroman, 77, of Seymour, passed away Saturday April 29, 2023 at Indiana University Hospital.

Born May 25, 1945, in Florida to Nathan Kroman and Vivian Gerstein, who preceded him in death. He married Margaret Brock Kroman on April 14, 1991, in San Jose, California. He and his wife are residents of Seymour and are parents of four grown children and three grandsons.

Stephen grew up in New York City where he graduated from Long Island University with a degree

Marine Biology. He was drafted into the Army and served thirteen months in Vietnam, achieving the rank of Sergeant E5 and earning "Soldier of the Month" for all US forces in Vietnam. He also received the Army Commendation Medal with Oak Leaf Clusters for actions during the Tet Offensive.

After discharge, he relocated to San Jose, CA, pursued a degree in Business and

started his own Financial Management Consulting firm, which he ran for over 35 years. After retirement he continued to share his expertise with charitable organizations and small businesses across California and Indiana.

Stephen relocated to Seymour in 2001 and began his fraternal journey. He was raised a Master Mason in April 2002, became a life endowed member of Jackson Lodge #146 in 2005, and served as Worshipful Master in 2008-2009. He was Eminent Commander of Seymour Commandry, High Priest for Seymour Chapter RAM #85, and following the merger of Seymour and Columbus York Rite was Illustrious Master of the Columbus Council #54. He also served as Secretary/Recorder of all three Bodies. He is a 32° member of the Indianapolis Valley and the George Rogers Clark Valley of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, and the Indianapolis Murat Shrine. He was also a member of Seymour Chapter #134, Order of the Eastern Star. Stephen was inducted into the St. Bernard de Clairvaux Council #256 of the Allied Masonic Degrees and served as Sovereign Master. He also was a member of the Royal Order of Scotland, the York Rite College of Corydon #207, and recipient of the Knights of York Cross of Honor.

Stephen served in many capacities in these fraternal orders including Grand Chaplain for Grand Chapter RAM of the State of Indiana, Grand Marshal for Grand Lodge, Area Representative for Area 34, Board member of the Indiana Masonic Home, and 10 years as Secretary-Treasurer and Board Member of the Masonic Heritage Foundation. Stephen was Grand Photographer for Indiana Grand Lodge since 2013. He has served on many committees for Grand Lodge including leading Treasurer's Workshops around the State. He also served in the Grand Commandry as Grand Marshal and aide, and Grand Prelate. He was awarded Grand Prelate Emeritus and Knight Commander of the Temple by the General Grand Encampment of Knights Templar.

He loved his family and being a grandpa, road trips, and traveling abroad. His hobbies included photography, cooking Asian cuisine, Science Fiction, and an appreciation for automobiles. In his earlier years he enjoyed scuba diving, snow skiing, camping and all things outdoors.

He has visited all 50 states, Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, England, Ireland, and Scotland.

WHEREAS: Drill Team members are dedicated to many hours of practice, sacrificing their time, energy, and fortune in preparing for and attending drill competitions.

WHEREAS: experienced drill members are enabled to instruct in sword skills and tactics that serve to benefit all Indiana Commanderies.

WHEREAS: there is no current form of uniform accoutrements specific to Drill Team members as drill bars are awarded to all who participate in pass in reviews.

WHEREAS: a proper acknowledgment is necessary to recognize and reward drill members for their perseverance, fidelity, and loyalty to the advancement of Templarism.

WHEREAS: Competitive Drills have declined over the past several years, and a highly visible form of recognition would serve to incentivize Sir Knights to augment existing or forming new Drill Teams, as they aspire to attain the right to wear the coveted Drill Cord.

WHEREAS: a means of displaying and rewarding the pride in Templar Drills that these Sir Knights possess, is well earned, and long overdue.

RESOLVED: that a shoulder cord in the fashion of the membership cord, consisting of gold and white, the first color being the outside color, be approved for wearing on the right shoulder of Sir Knights who are active Drill Team members, thereby recognizing those Sir Knights for promoting, expanding, and perpetuating the legendary Indiana Drills tradition.

RESOLVED: that a shoulder cord of white and gold, reversing the active membership colors, be approved for wearing on the right shoulder for those Sir Knights who have actively participated in drills for a period of not less than 10 years, that may be worn thereafter, thereby honoring their long commitment and sacrifices in preserving the storied history of Indiana Drills.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that owing to the innate knowledge of the respective Drill Captains, it shall be the sole discretion of said Captains to determine eligibility of/and awarding of Drill Cord.

I've had conversations with your Grandmaster last night Gary and with your Grand Commander about ritual and I think one of the things that we hope to do to make commandery more welcoming to our new Sir Knights is to stress the need to be able to do ritual in our own commanders. Not to have festivals to be able to Knight locally our new Sir Knights that and welcoming them into our commandery with ritual that is performed by their fellows. For Knights in the commandery now I know it's not possible everywhere, but it should be a goal of all of us to do more to personalization of our rituals and tactics.

David is going to encourage that next year. David Cussman all of us who are privileged to serve him are going to encourage you to do that I hope you'll take at the heart and I hope you'll take the time to develop good ritual skills so that we can present them to our Sir Knights that said I thank you for the opportunity to serve you this year I it is indeed a pleasure to be here in Indiana and thank you for the opportunity to attend your grand sessions Sir Knights

Comments from Most Worshipful Master Of the Free & Accepted Freemason of Indiana Sir Knight Gary Brinley

It has been my pleasure to be here today. I have enjoyed watching the debate the discussions have being able to be a part of of this event today.

I want to talk to you just a little bit about membership, but I'm going to be real brief because I think I'm between you and lunch. Grand Lodge of Indiana membership, that was my number one priority for 2023. We raised 817 master Masons that's 100 above 2022 but still only add a 2% raising rate. Based on our beginning balance our membership numbers have dropped down to 39,400 at the end of 12/31/23 and as of about a week ago we were below 39,000 at 38,980. We've been losing membership at about 3 1/2 percent rate. I ran the numbers that Ed reported earlier and the Grand Commandery only dropped by 2.4% so a little better results then at the Grand Lodge level so to be commended for that.

The second one was proficiency trying to move candidates through the degrees and not force them to become ritualist as they're coming through the degrees.

I was looking up a a member the other day I was pulled up his lodge and one of the things that was really interesting was in the Grand Lodge database, that lodge had 29 aged EA. So, 29 men that had enough interest to petition the lodge but yet somehow, they had not gone beyond that first step, and I have no idea the reason why.

It was just something I found really interesting that we had 29 and that just that one lodge I think of the change that could be made if there's 29 for others EA's had become master Masons.

Randy just want to thank you and the Grand Commandery for the hospitality shown to Marilyn and I this weekend. I appreciate everything that everyone here does for Templary and Indiana I'm here to support you both as Grandmaster, Passed Grandmaster as well as trying to keep the commandery in Bloomington moving forward.

So with that I look forward to installation here in about 3 hours and I'm going to step aside and allow us to get to lunch thank you.

GRAND COMMANDERY KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF INDIANA

General Order No. 1 Ellington April 26, 2023

Annual Inspections and Receptions of Constituent Commandery(s)

Sir Knights of Indiana where so ever dispersed:

In pursuant to the provisions of Section 851 and 852 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of the Jurisdiction be inspected.

All Commanderies will be Inspected on the Opening with Rehearsal of Duties and the Inspection on an Order that will be held on the Stated Conclave of the Commandery that is being Inspected, unless prior permission has been given by the Grand Commander or Grand Inspector General to hold the Inspection or Opening on a separated date.

If a cancelation or the changing of a date is to happen for any reason a written request to the Grand Commander and Grand Inspector General must be received at least 2 weeks prior to the Original Inspection Date with the reason for the Cancellation/Change in Date unless in the case of an Emergency, we will follow the Next Sir Knight Up Philosophy, so you should think of re-casting prior to the Calculation or Change of Date of the Inspection or Order. This written request also must be received with a reason from the Eminent Commander of the Hosting Commandery and will include a new date with a 2–3 week advanced notice that will require approval of the Grand Commander and the Grand Inspector General before it is rescheduled. (We all have schedules to work with, please plan ahead for the date you set.)

- 1. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within his Battalion with the following exceptions:
- The Grand Inspector General or a Deputy Grand Inspector General(s) will be required to inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected Grand Commandery Officer, excluding the Commandery of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder unless an additional Grand Officer(s)s are members of that Commandery.
- A fellow Grand Line Officer/Battalion Commander will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each appointed Grand Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other exceptions or substitutions.
- Deputy Battalion Commander(s) are suggested to assist in the grading of the Inspections and the Inspection of the Books and Records when possible.
- 2. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter (email or mailed) to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection if the letter is mailed, then an email copy is also to be sent to the Eminent Commander and Recorder and

CC'd to the Grand Inspector General and the Deputy Grand Commander. This letter is found on the Grand Commandery Website and will confirm the date, time, and location of the Inspection with the Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and will also include a copy of the blank reports to be fill out by the Recorder prior to the inspection. The requested completed reports will be provided to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival (Activities Sheet, Recorder's Questionnaire, Cast list for the Order/Opening)

3. The records Inspected will be detailed on the Recorder's Questionnaire will include but not limited to:

- A report on the membership efforts.
- Examination of the Recorder's and Treasurer's books, records, and accounts.
- Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery.
- Activity sheet.
- Current 990-N Filed Tax Form.
- Current copy of the By-laws dated by the Grand Commandery.
- 4. No Inspection will be deemed complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records of both the Recorder and Treasurer. If they are not presented at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible Officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the needed items to be inspected to the Inspecting Officer by or at the next stated Conclave of that Commandery or upon an agreeable date prior to the end of the Inspection Year if further time is needed but only with approval of the Grand Commander. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.

* The Battalion Commander/Inspecting Officer will leave the Inspection or Reception with ALL

paperwork pertaining to the Inspection or Reception.

- 5. Each Inspection will start promptly on the date(s) and time(s) mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer.
- 6. The Inspection will be on the conferral of the Order of the Temple, the Order of Red Cross or the Order of Malta in Full Form. All Inspections must be completed by December 31st 2023.

* All Commanderies should do their best to have a candidate for the Inspection if possible.

- 7. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Opening for the Rehearsal of Duties, Reception and Order conferral. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to provide any needed assistance. If an actual candidate is present, the quality of the work is of prime importance.
- 8. Inspections may consist of up to two (2) Commanderies participating together for an Official Inspection with a minimum of 6 Members of Each Commandery present. Points for the Inspection will only be awarded when a participating Commandery has six (6) or more of its member's present (subject to review by the Battalion Commander and the Grand

Commander). If less than 6 members are present from a Commandery No Points will be awarded. If a Commandery not having the Required number of Sir Knights (6) Present at the Inspection of the Opening and or the Inspection on the Order to be able to receive a Grade, the Eminent Commander will be required to make a report to the Grand Commander within 30 days of the Inspection. They then will be placed on Probation till the end of the Commandery year or until they are able to complete an Opening and/or Order with the required number of Sir Knights present with or without assistance.

- 9. The Inspection will consist of the following: Inspection of Order and Opening can be done separately.
- Short Form Opening with Rehearsal of Duties
- 1 of the Following Order's, Order of Red Cross, Order of Malta or Order of the Temple in Full Form
- Along with the Flag Presentation
- Closing
- 10. The Inspecting Officer shall make his inspection report (Tally Sheet Landscape) of each Commandery to the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Inspector General, the Deputy Grand Commander, as well as the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the inspected Commandery within fourteen (14) days following the completion of the inspection. All other required paperwork will be kept by the Battalion Commander and made immediately available upon request. A full report of the Inspections may be discussed at the winter meeting and appropriate recognition will be made at the Annual Conclave.
- 11. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the combined score Opening with Rehearsal of Duties, One of the following Order's (Order of the Temple, Order of Red Cross of the Order of Malta), Flag Presentation and Closing. All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.
- 12. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each Battalion on the "Activity Score Sheet" will also be recognized by a ribbon presented at the Grand Commandery Session. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.
- 13. A Commandery(s) using an exemplar in place of an actual candidate will confer the Order as if they had an actual candidate and scored as such by the Inspecting Officer. (Hermits and Guards may be limited to 1 of each)

Instructionals

An Instructional may be held in lieu of an Inspection on the Order of the Temple when the Inspecting Officer, with the concurrence of the Grand Inspector General and approval of the Grand Commander deems that change to be in the best interests of the Commandery(s).

• If an Instructional is to be held, then the Commandery(s) participating will be required to hold an Order of the Temple for a Grade by the end of the Commandery Year, which must be attended by the Eminent Commander, Generalissimo, Captain General, Recorder, Treasurer of

said Commandery and at least 2 additional Sir Knights from each Commandery which participated in the Instructional.

Bonus Points

• If a Sir Knight that is giving a credible ritual performance of the Prelates Address, Ode to the Skull, or the Junior Wardens address (Chamber of Reflection) for the first time at the Inspection by memory, they can receive an additional 100 points to this Sir Knight's Commandery only, the points will be reflected on the score sheet at the discretion of the Inspecting Officer.

• 500 Bonus Points will be awarded if a Commandery can Both confer the Opening with Rehearsal of Duties and on Order in Full Form with 100% of the cast members (*) being from that Commandery and by memory, without the use of rituals, these bonus points will be shown on the tally sheet. The Dais Officers must be present and in preform the work for the Opening and Rehearsal of Duties.

• (*) If a Sir Knight is participating in his first Order or Opening and he has been Knighted within 1 year of said Opening or Order and is using a Ritual, he will not be penalized on the Inspection Sheet.

• If the Grand Commander is present for the Order, it is his prerogative to award up to an additional 200 extra bonus points if he sees fit based on Commandery(s) performance, this may be awarded to either Commandery or both, if there are more than one Commandery being inspected.

• Scores will be equally given to the Commandery(s) participating in the Order based on the number of members participating in the Order (6 members minimum must participate in order to receive a score) The inspection of the Order may occur any time after June 1, 2023 and prior to the 31st of December, 2023.

• Inspection scores will be separated by officer ranking only. A non-member of any Commandery being Inspected will receive an officer score of 0 and Errors on the score sheet will not count against the Commandery(s) being Inspected. All members or officers of the participating Inspected Commandery(s) will receive an officer score of 1-20.

Reception of the Eminent Commander

Each Commandery will be **<u>Required</u>** to hold a Public Opening for the Reception of the Eminent Commander including the Presentation of the United States Flag, the Opening will be done without the Introduction of Distinguished Guests. Each Recorder and Battalion Commander will be giving the Ritual that is to be use that, which will have that part Omitted. Each Commandery (maximum 2 Commandery(s) will be allowed to participate together unless prior permission is given by the Grand Commander or the Grand Inspector General for up to 3) 100 points will be awarded for this on the Activity Sheet (6 members minimum to per Commandery participating to receive credit). If the Commandery chooses to do the 12 Man Open Reception of the Commander (without Distinguished Guests being introduced) they will receive 250 points for each Commandery participating (6 members minimum; per Commandery participating to receive credit).

A Uniform Inspection of each Sir Knight will take place during the Inspection of the Lines portion of the Reception. An inspection grade of up to 20 additional points awarded per Sir Knight graded and will be awarded on the Activity Sheet.

- The public may be invited into the Asylum for the Open Reception of the Commander including the Flag Presentation and Triangle.
- Uniform Inspection: 20 points possible per Sir Knight being inspected and will be awarded on the Activity

Sheet with points being awarded to the Sir Knights Commandery (If a Sir Knight belongs to 2 or all

Commandery(s) being Inspected, points will be dispersed to only 1 Commandery at the Sir Knights request.

- Presenting the United States Flag: Points will be awarded on Score Sheet if not previously Scored during an Order.
- There are NO provisions in this portion of General Order #1 stating that "If a Eminent Commander has been Eminent Commander many time he may Opt-Out of having a Reception" If a Reception is not either held by a Commandery Separately or in Conjunction with an Order prior to December 31st 2023 then one will be required to be held prior to the end of the Templar Year.

Instructions following the Inspection of the Order or Reception, prior to Closing

Upon completion of each Inspection and prior to Closing, the Eminent Commander shall give his remarks first, followed by the Inspecting Officer. The Grand Commander, if present, will follow with his remarks. Whenever he is not present, the Inspecting Officer, acting as the Grand Commander's Official Representative, shall be accorded all the honors and courtesies due him as such. If the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Indiana is present, he will speak after the Grand Commander; otherwise, the Grand Commander is the final speaker.

General Order No. 1A Ellington July 30th, 2023

Annual Inspections and Receptions of Constituent Commandery(s)

Sir Knights of Indiana where so ever dispersed:

In pursuant to the provisions of Section 851 and 852 of the Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Indiana, it is hereby ordered that the Constituent Commanderies of the Jurisdiction be inspected.

All Commanderies will be Inspected on the Opening with Rehearsal of Duties and the Inspection on an Order that will be held on the Stated Conclave of the Commandery that is being Inspected, unless prior permission has been given by the Grand Commander or Grand Inspector General to hold the Inspection or Opening on a separated date.

If a cancelation or the changing of a date is to happen for any reason a written request to the Grand Commander and Grand Inspector General must be received at least 2 weeks prior to the Original Inspection Date with the reason for the Cancellation/Change in Date unless in the case of an Emergency, we will follow the Next Sir Knight Up Philosophy, so you should think of re-casting prior to the Calculation or Change of Date of the Inspection or Order. This written request also must be received with a reason from the Eminent Commander of the Hosting Commandery and will include a new date with a 2–3 week advanced notice that will require approval of the Grand Commander and the Grand Inspector General before it is rescheduled. (We all have schedules to work with, please plan ahead for the date you set.)

- 10. The Battalion Commander shall inspect each Commandery within his Battalion with the following exceptions:
- The Grand Inspector General or a Deputy Grand Inspector General(s) will be required to inspect the designated primary Commandery of each elected Grand Commandery Officer, excluding the Commandery of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder unless an additional Grand Officer(s)s are members of that Commandery.
- A fellow Grand Line Officer/Battalion Commander will inspect the designated primary Commandery of each appointed Grand Officer, if it is within the Battalion of the latter. Only the Grand Commander may authorize other exceptions or substitutions.
- Deputy Battalion Commander(s) are suggested to assist in the grading of the Inspections and the Inspection of the Books and Records when possible.
- 11. Each Inspecting Officer will send a "Notice of Inspection" courtesy letter (email or mailed) to the Eminent Commander and Recorder at least 30 days prior to the Inspection if the letter is

mailed, then an email copy is also to be sent to the Eminent Commander and Recorder and CC'd to the Grand Inspector General and the Deputy Grand Commander. This letter is found on the Grand Commandery Website and will confirm the date, time, and location of the Inspection with the Inspecting Officer's time of arrival and will also include a copy of the blank reports to be fill out by the Recorder prior to the inspection. The requested completed reports will be provided to the Inspecting Officer upon his arrival (Activities Sheet, Recorder's Questionnaire, Cast list for the Order/Opening)

12. The records Inspected will be detailed on the Recorder's Questionnaire will include but not limited to:

- A report on the membership efforts.
- Examination of the Recorder's and Treasurer's books, records, and accounts.
- Examination of the paraphernalia and property of the Commandery.
- Activity sheet.
- Current 990-N and NP-20 Tax Forms Filed.
- Current copy of the By-laws dated by the Grand Commandery.
- 13. No Inspection will be deemed complete until the Inspecting Officer has reviewed all books and financial records of both the Recorder and Treasurer. If they are not presented at the Inspection, it shall be the duty of the responsible Officer (Treasurer or Recorder) to deliver the needed items to be inspected to the Inspecting Officer by or at the next stated Conclave of that Commandery or upon an agreeable date prior to the end of the Inspection Year if further time is needed but only with approval of the Grand Commander. Failure to comply may cause the Commandery to be placed upon probation until the obligation has been fulfilled.

* The Battalion Commander/Inspecting Officer will leave the Inspection or Reception with ALL

paperwork pertaining to the Inspection or Reception.

- 14. Each Inspection will start promptly on the date(s) and time(s) mutually agreed upon with the respective Inspecting Officer.
- 15. The Inspection will be on the conferral of the Order of the Temple, the Order of Red Cross or the Order of Malta in Full Form. All Inspections must be completed by December 31st 2023.

* All Commanderies should do their best to have a candidate for the Inspection if possible.

- 16. It is preferred that the regularly elected and appointed officers of the Commandery fill their respective stations during the Opening for the Rehearsal of Duties, Reception and Order conferral. If necessary, officers and members may assume other stations, particularly during the Order. Commanderies are encouraged to work with each other to provide any needed assistance. If an actual candidate is present, the quality of the work is of prime importance.
- 17. Inspections may consist of up to two (2) Commanderies participating together for an Official Inspection with a minimum of 6 Members of Each Commandery present. Points for the Inspection will only be awarded when a participating Commandery has six (6) or more of its

member's present (subject to review by the Battalion Commander and the Grand Commander). If less than 6 members are present from a Commandery No Points will be awarded. If a Commandery not having the Required number of Sir Knights (6) Present at the Inspection of the Opening and or the Inspection on the Order to be able to receive a Grade, the Eminent Commander will be required to make a report to the Grand Commander within 30 days of the Inspection. They then will be placed on Probation till the end of the Commandery year or until they are able to complete an Opening and/or Order with the required number of Sir Knights present with or without assistance.

- 18. The Inspection will consist of the following: Inspection of Order and Opening can be done separately.
- Short Form Opening with Rehearsal of Duties
- 1 of the Following Order's, Order of Red Cross, Order of Malta or Order of the Temple in Full Form
- Along with the Flag Presentation
- Closing
- 14. The Inspecting Officer shall make his inspection report (Tally Sheet Landscape) of each Commandery to the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Inspector General, the Deputy Grand Commander, as well as the Eminent Commander and the Recorder of the inspected Commandery within fourteen (14) days following the completion of the inspection. All other required paperwork will be kept by the Battalion Commander and made immediately available upon request. A full report of the Inspections may be discussed at the winter meeting and appropriate recognition will be made at the Annual Conclave.
- 15. The Battalion Guidon will be awarded to the Commandery in each Battalion who has the highest ritualistic score. The ritualistic score shall be the combined score Opening with Rehearsal of Duties, One of the following Order's (Order of the Temple, Order of Red Cross of the Order of Malta), Flag Presentation and Closing. All Commanderies will be graded according to the forms and procedures adopted for that purpose.
- 16. The two Commanderies scoring highest in each Battalion on the "Activity Score Sheet" will also be recognized by a ribbon presented at the Grand Commandery Session. The Commandery with the highest activity score in the state will receive the Grand Commandery Guidon for the coming year.
- 17. A Commandery(s) using an exemplar in place of an actual candidate will confer the Order as if they had an actual candidate and scored as such by the Inspecting Officer. (Hermits and Guards may be limited to 1 of each)

Instructionals

An Instructional may be held in lieu of an Inspection on the Order of the Temple when the Inspecting Officer, with the concurrence of the Grand Inspector General and approval of the Grand Commander deems that change to be in the best interests of the Commandery(s).

• If an Instructional is to be held, then the Commandery(s) participating will be required to hold an Order of the Temple for a Grade by the end of the Commandery Year, which must be

attended by the Eminent Commander, Generalissimo, Captain General, Recorder, Treasurer of said Commandery and at least 2 additional Sir Knights from each Commandery which participated in the Instructional.

Bonus Points

• If a Sir Knight that is giving a credible ritual performance of the Prelates Address, Ode to the Skull, or the Junior Wardens address (Chamber of Reflection) for the first time at the Inspection by memory, they can receive an additional 100 points to this Sir Knight's Commandery only, the points will be reflected on the score sheet at the discretion of the Inspecting Officer.

• 500 Bonus Points will be awarded if a Commandery can Both confer the Opening with Rehearsal of Duties and on Order in Full Form with 100% of the cast members (*) being from that Commandery and by memory, without the use of rituals, these bonus points will be shown on the tally sheet. The Dais Officers must be present and in preform the work for the Opening and Rehearsal of Duties.

• (*) If a Sir Knight is participating in his first Order or Opening and he has been Knighted within 1 year of said Opening or Order and is using a Ritual, he will not be penalized on the Inspection Sheet.

• If the Grand Commander is present for the Order, it is his prerogative to award up to an additional 200 extra bonus points if he sees fit based on Commandery(s) performance, this may be awarded to either Commandery or both, if there are more than one Commandery being inspected.

If the Commandery chooses to do the 12 Man Open Reception of the Commander (**With or** without Distinguished Guests being introduced) they will receive 250 points for each Commandery participating (6 members minimum; per Commandery participating to receive credit).

•Upon Knighting, each Sir Knight should be assigned a Mentor whose responsibility it will be to assist the new Sir Knight to remain an active member by inviting him to all functions personally, helping him become involved in the Commandery to the extent that the new Sir Knight is able, and answering all questions that he and his family pose.

•The Recorder is responsible for providing a "New Member Packet" to the new Sir Knight containing information about the Commandery and Templary. This may include a calendar, newsletter, Commandery history, philanthropies, and information on Conclaves, activities, and officers.

Each new officer in the line will also be assigned a mentor, preferably a Past Commander or Dais Officer, to provide guidance and encouragement to the new officer and to instruct and answer questions he will have as he advances.
The officer's mentor shall make certain that the new officer has the proper ritual, tactics, officer's handbook bylaws, and other information he needs to succeed. The mentor shall assist the new officer in preparing his uniform and equipment and assist him with proficiency in protocols and practices.

The Recorder will record the name of the mentors in the <u>Notes Section in</u> <u>MMS</u> and the Generalissimo will be assigned to administer and monitor the mentorship program and to oversee the development of new Sir Knights and officers. I have requested the Battalion Commanders and Deputies to assist you, the Eminent Commander, in implementing the program.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD FOR SIR KNIGHTS

Rules and Regulations

An award to be known as the **''DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD''** (for Sir Knights) was established by the Grand Commandery of Indiana on May 6, 1977, at the 123rd Annual Conclave. It is to be conferred upon members, who, by distinguished service to Templary are worthy of such an award. The recipients to be selected and the award to be presented as follows:

- 1. The recipient must be a member in good standing of a Commandery.
- The Eminent Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General, will acting together, present the nomination for the award as suggested by members of their Commandery. - 6. The award shall consist of a jewel engraved with the words "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD, Grand Commandery of Indiana" In addition thereto an appropriate certificate of the award shall be prepared and signed by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, attested by the Grand Recorder. Also, the signature of the Eminent Commander and attested by the Recorder of the Commandery. The jewel and certificate shall be the same for all Commanderies and under the control of the Grand Commandery of Indiana.
- 7. The cost of the jewel, certificate and any additional engraving shall be borne by each Commandery presenting a nomination. Each Commandery will be send a check to the Grand Recorder accompanying the nomination form for the cost. If a check is not received then the nomination form will be returned to the Recorder of requesting Commandery.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 237 (b) of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar, USA, a meritorious award known as the Knights Templar Cross of Honor may be conferred by the Grand Master upon a deserving Sir Knight (or Knights, depending on Grand Commandery membership counts) of each Grand Commandery once each year.

It is to be noted that this award is to be made only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order of Knights Templar far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an Officer or Member. <u>No Elected</u> Grand Commandery or Grand Encampment Officer, past or present, is eligible to receive the award. This honor is for the Sir Knight of your Commandery who you consider has been, or is, outstanding in his Chivalric labors.

"KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR" RULES AND REGULATIONS

(1) In accordance with the provisions of Section 237 (b) of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, as amended at the 50th Triennial Conclave, the meritorious Award known as the **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR**, shall be conferred by the Grand Master on behalf of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to deserving Sir Knights of Constituent and Subordinate Commanderies upon certain conditions hereinafter set forth.

(2) The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR shall be awarded "only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member." In deciding upon the award, precedents shall be entirely ignored, and each case shall be decided upon its own unusual merits. No posthumous award shall be made, and no present or past elected Grand Officer of a Grand Commandery shall be eligible for the award.

(3) Only one nomination may be made from a Grand Commandery membership of 5,000 or less, plus one additional nomination may be made by a Grand Commandery for each additional 5,000 of its members, or major fraction thereof, during any one year. Only one nomination may be made from the total of the Subordinate Commanderies during one year.

(4) The procedure to be followed for making nominations for this Award shall be as follows:
 a. Any Constituent Commandery desiring to make a nomination shall first adopt a formal resolution, setting forth the full name of its nominee, and the nature of the meritorious service upon which such nomination is based.

b. The Commander of such Constituent Commandery shall thereupon cause to be filled-in a nomination form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of his Grand Commandery, giving the date, full name of the nominee, address, and Templar rank, name of his Commandery and a statement of the nature of the meritorious service upon.

c. Such Nomination Form shall be signed by the Commander of such Constituent Commandery and shall be forwarded by him to the Grand Commander of his jurisdiction for consideration.

d. Such Grand Commander shall consider nominations made Constituent Commanderies of his Grand Commandery upon Nomination Forms and shall select only one nominee (more where qualified) in anyone year; upon making such selection, the Grand Commander shall affix his written approval to such Nomination Form and shall thereupon send the name to the Grand Master.

e. Any Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination for this Award shall follow the same procedure as is set forth above for Constituent Commanderies, except that such Subordinate Commandery desiring to make a nomination, shall forward the Nomination Form to be supplied by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment, and the same shall bear the written approval of the Commander of such Subordinate Commandery before being sent by to the Grand Master.

(5) The **KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR** medal shall consist of a round, goldfinished medal, the outer circle of which shall bear the words "KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR," showing through in black enamel, and in the center shall appear the Patriarchal Cross of the Grand Encampment in purple enamel. Such medal shall be suspended from a gold-finished bar by two small chain links on either side; upon the face of the bar shall be engraved the name of the Sir Knight who shall be the recipient thereof. The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medal may be worn upon the uniform by the recipient upon all occasions.

(6) A suitable Certificate of Award, issued by the Grand Encampment, signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Recorder, and bearing the seal of the Grand Encampment

thereon, shall accompany the medal. The Certificate shall contain a summary of the Citation upon which such Award is based.

(7) It shall the responsibility of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to provide the medals, the Certificates of Award for the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR, without any cost to the recipient or to his Constituent or Grand Commandery, or his Subordinate Commandery. Presentation of the KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR Medals, Certificates shall be made at an appropriate ceremony by Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies, and a report thereof sent by the respective Recorder to the Grand Recorder of the Grand Encampment within thirty days thereafter.

Credit for previous exemplifications will be accepted on your honor as a Knight Templar.

Ed's family extended beyond his immediate kin, as he was an esteemed member of Freemasonry for 55 years, and a DeMolay for 60 years receiving the Legion of Honor. He fully embraced the principles of brotherhood, charity, and integrity, serving in many leadership roles in Masonry, church, and the Boy Scouts. If you needed something done, Ed was your man.

With pen in hand and a heart full of stories, Ed made his mark as an award-winning writer for the Vincennes Sun-Commercial newspaper. His words captured the essence of local events and offered uplifting stories and insights that inspired the community and he was the longtime Editor of the Indiana Knights Templar Supplement.

A memorial service to celebrate Ed's life will be held at the Vincennes #1 Masonic Lodge on Saturday, Sept. 2, from 11:00 a.m. till 2:00 p.m. with a Knights Templar Honor Guard.
